York: ^{Gov. Soapy} Williams of Michigan, ^{Gov.} Almond of Virginia, and ^{Gov. Mike} DiSalle of
Ohio. All three ^{cheering} ~~impressed by~~ the Rockefeller program for
national defense.

^{For one, Gov.} happy about their colleague from New York. ^{Handley} of Indiana
defended - the Eisenhower record, ^{arguing}, that America has
been strong - for the past eight years.

JOHNSON

Senator Lyndon Johnson is definitely in the presidential race - in it to stay. So says Johnson's fellow Texan - Speaker Sam Rayburn. Speaker Rayburn, today was trying to spike a rumor - that Johnson is about to withdraw. Rayburn, declaring that Johnson's ^{problem} as everybody knows, is to stop a Kennedy "blitz" at the Convention. He says if Kennedy doesn't get the nomination on an early ballot, then the Democratic Convention will turn to - Lyndon Johnson. That's the prediction of Sam Rayburn, a wise veteran of many political wars.

DISARMAMENT

RUSSIAN ROCKETS

The Russians announce they'll fire a new series of rockets into the Central Pacific - from July Fifth through the Thirty-first. Multi-stage rockets, says Moscow Radio but without the final stage. The impact area - north of Phoenix Island, near the Hawaii to Brisbane shipping route.

The new rocket series - apparently a follow-up to the Soviet Pacific rocket tests earlier this year.

Tonight's Moscow announcement coming only a few hours after speeches by Khrushchev and Defense Minister Malinovsky - both claiming strengthening of Soviet military forces, with accent on the switch to rocket weapons.

MINE

The word from Abertille, Wales, is that the mine death toll - may be over forty. The result of ~~that~~^{the} underground explosion, ~~the blast~~, causing a cave-in -- that trapped more than fifty miners a thousand feet below ground.

Those near the entrance - managing to dig their way out. The rest - buried deeper in the shaft. Those who escaped the falling rock - were killed by deadly monoxide gas.

An old and sombre story in Wales -- ever since the industrial revolution began. ~~The tragedy of the~~^Q mine cave-in.

FIRE

The cause of last ~~night~~ night's Boston fire - is still unknown. The blaze, beginning in the hold of - a Honduras freighter - loaded with Cuban sugar. Flames, spreading to a warehouse full of - Cuban sugar. Sixty million pounds of it.
