The White House - President Ford met today with top Republicans in Congress. Senate minority leader Hugh Scott saying the meeting was devoted mainly to discussing the President's options - with regard to energy policy; adding that the President was seriously considering a possible compromise with Democratic leaders. It was even said the President would probably make his decision known by four this afternoon. However, Scott's remarks were later amended by White House spokesman Ron Nessen who said the President would confer by phone - with Democratic leaders; but stressed - "there will be no announcement today." That to come tomorrow - we are told; along with the President's veto of the bill - aimed at banning an increase on oil import fees.

At Nairobi, Kenya - a weekend blast in a crowded bus - killing twenty seven and injuring more than a hundred. And now a series of bomb scares - forcing the evacuation of thousands from downtown buildings. Police reporting at least ten full-scale bomb hoaxes along with about a thousand telephone bomb threats. Adding that obviously this is all the work of terrorists - but who and why they say - is soul a mystery.
