# IMMIGRATION - PALESTINE

The British have raised the blockade on Jewish immigrantion to Palestine. This morning a thousand ton steamer brought three-hundred and sixty Jewish immigrants from Cyprus, where some twenty-five thousand others are interned awaiting quota numbers.

The word is that the British will now assist these immigrants to enter the Holy Land as quickly as possible.

The Jews already have set up welfare facilities for ten thousand immigrants. Prime Minister David Ben Gurion says all able-bodied men among the refugees will be drafted into the armed forces or put to work -- valuable reinforcements for the Jewish Army.

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With the declaration of a new Jewish state the soil of the Holy Land will be under Jewish sovereignty for the first time in twenty centuries. For two thousand years Palestine has been in the hands of the Romans, the Saracens, the Urusaders, the Turks,

and, the British.

BRITISH PALESTINE (substitute for original)

There is a searchlight display over the ancient Palestinian port of Haifa tonight. The white fingers of a dozen searchlights from British battleships tracing eccelese patterns through the carkenes skies. These vessels are waiting to take aboard at the ships with to receive his Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for Palestine, Sir Alan Cunningham. When Sir Alan steps wher aboard the cruiser Euryalus, at nine-thirty tomorrow morning, Britain's thirty-year rule over the Holy Land will be officially with ended.

Then, when he got back to his headquarters, General Watson of course had to report to his Chief, Major General Sir John Shea, who commanded the Fiftieth London Division. But, General Shea naturally felt that he was entitled to receive that all-important surrender. So, General Watson had to dash back to Jerusalem and arrange for the Mayor to do it all over again.

Whereupon, the next day General Shea appeared with his staff. The people sang and cheered, with a little less enthusiasm. The Mayor delivered that address of welcome again, Mot quite so eloquently; and the city was turned over to General Shea.

Of Course Sir John had to report all this to his commander-in-chief, the General who was the top military leader of the Allied armies in the Near East, Sir Edmund Allenby, efterwards known as Field Marshal

Shea that the official surrender would take place on December Eleventh. So, the Mayor of the Holy City had to be told that he must do it all over again.

And so it came to pass that on December Eleventh, 1917, Allenby arrived outside the Jaffa Gate, with t his staff, and accompanied by representatives of all the Allied nations. Among them a Colonel Ri Edward Davis of the U.S. Can't Cavalry, officially representing Uncle Sam. Colonel Davis now lives in retirement, somewhere in Illinois, I believe. Once more the people of the Holy City flocked to the streets and housetops, singing and cheering -- rather feebly. Once more the Mayor stood there beside the Tower md of David, Again the Mayor delivered that speech of welcome, rather for the fourth time Jerusalem fell:

A month later the Mayor of Jerusalem died of pneumonia. And the story in the Holy City was that he died from exposure, from making that speech of welcome so many times.

### INVASION FOLLOW PALESTINE

#### FIGHTER PLANE

Uncle Sam has a new fighter plane for bomber protection. A three thousand horse jet fighter. A "parasite" they call it -- to be carried inside such giant bombers as the B-36 and the B-29. Big bombers to carry their own fighter protection when on five thousand mile sorties.
