Connor - to turn out highways into "open windows" - clean

Too often in the past - said he, "the view from our highways has been marred by barren landscapes, automobile grave yards, a conglomeration of billboar's and other unsightly clutter, a careless destruction of our God-given and man-made beauty." The public - he concluded - wants something better and ought to get it.
