Ravenna, Ohio - the ~~jury returns.~~ ^{special} A special grand jury today submit^{ed}ing its findings - in the death of ~~those~~ ^e four students at ~~nearby~~ Kent State ~~&~~ University.

The panel's report - exonerating completely the Ohio National guardsmen who fired the fatal bullets. Instead, indicting ~~including~~ ^{alleged} twenty-five ~~to students and~~ "agitators" -- on forty-three counts of alleged "deliberate, criminal action".

The Grand Jury further placing major blame - on the Kent State Administration; which it accused of gross "over indulgence and permissiveness." The ~~pane~~ panel's report saying: "it is apparent that an apathetic university community - has allowed a vocal minority to seize control of the university campus. And it adds: This will continue - until such time as the citizens, university administration, faculty and students - take a strong stand against the radical element bent on violence."

MONTREAL

A bit further North - in Canada - Operation Red Alert today. Canadian Prime Minister Trudeau - invoking emergency war powers; Sending some four thousand federal troops into Quebec Province - there to begin a mass arrest of radical French Canadian separatists; hoping thus to smash once and for all - the terrorist front de liberation de Quebec.

Operation Red Alert headquarters in Montreal later reporting some two hundred ~~and~~ arrests in more than a hundred raids in five cities. ^{As for the} ~~Two~~ two kidnapped officials - at last report ~~though~~ - still missing.

WASHINGTON

A related item: Washington today ~~confirms~~
ordering a special bomb alert - in federal buildings
~~clear~~^{right} across the U S. This to include a surveillance
of all visitors - coupled with an inspection of all bags
and packages. A spokesman for the General Services
Administration - which operates the buildings - saying:
"We're not trying to panic people - ~~also~~^{but} ~~BT~~ it's a
psychological thing; if a person has to walk in front
of a guard - he's not likely to carry in something
dangerous."

The White House - President Nixon stepping
up his campaign activities, ~~today~~ announcing plans to
visit as many as twenty states - before the November
Third election. These including - among the newest
entries - Illinois and ~~the~~ Minnesota; which the
President will ^{visit} ~~from~~ - October twenty-ninth.

The White House also ~~na~~ announced that Pat
Nixon is undertaking a rigorous campaign schedule of
her own; starting with a series of appearances next Monday
and Tuesday - in Michigan, ~~the~~ Minnesota and Nevada.

The Vice President saying - he "did not agree" with the Governor's tactics. "But I do think he did a good job and served a very useful purpose," said ^{Vice Pres.} ~~Spive~~

Agnew, - "in bringing the situation to the attention of the people and prodding court action."

INDO CHINA

On the other side of the globe - ground
action in South Vietnam was again reported "light and
scattered" ~~today~~. In Cambodia though ^{there was} a Communist
attack on the village of "Rokar Kong" only twenty miles
north of Phnom Penh. The Cambodian ~~commander~~ commander
at Rokar Kong later reporting: Our situation is
very serious. Rokar Kong apparently chosen as the
latest Communist target - because it contains - ~~among~~
among other things, Cambodia's only gin distillery.

UNITED NATIONS

At the United Nations, New York - Egypt

takes the offensive. Charging today that the U S -
has itself violated the current Mid-East cease fire.

This - ~~which~~ said Egypt - by supplying additional war
planes to Egypt; thus reneging on a pledge not to do
so - while mid-east peace efforts were under way.

Egypt's charge coming in the first comprehensive

~~In line with this, Brimmer urging, first and foremost - a concerted effort to stem the soaring crime rate in black ~~communities~~ communities. The economic loss from such crime - said he - perhaps as much as three billion a year; thereby dissipating "a significant share of the hard-earned income - that the black community has struggled to accumulate." ~~Brimmer adding:~~~~

~~"The time is long since passed when voices in the black community should be raised against this rising tide of violence and aggression."~~

"old man" of the Communist Huk movement. A pair
of communist turn-~~coats~~ coats -- backed by Army
troops - trapping El Supremo today in a thatched hut
in Central Luzon. When he went for his gun - the

LONDON

A couple of news photos of Britain's Princess Margaret dressed in ~~color~~ midi-length fashions - widely circulated this week in the U S and Britain; ~~and~~ ^{or} now - the subject of a London editorial. KANAZAWA

In view of campus unrest right around the globe - this next is perhaps of special note. At Kanazawa University - Kanazawa, Japan - professor Toyoyoshi Inoue refusing to give final exams to forty-eight students in his ~~legat~~ medicine class. The professor explaining that these were campus radicals - who had previously attempted to close down the medical school. "And besides" said he "doctors tend to become arrogant because they treat the weak; the radicals are already arrogant - I don't want to see them become doctors."

The professor adding: "What they have sown - they must now reap."
