GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

A far-reaching, five-point program for fighting inflation was launched today by President Johnson.

Including a request to congress for temporary suspension -- of the present seven percent investment tax credit for business, which many economists have denounced as the single most inflationary injection into the nation's economy.

In addition -- the President asks Congress for a sixteen month suspension -- of laws permitting business to benefit from an accelerated deprectation program. Also, the Federal Reserve Board -- to help bring down high interest rates.

And -- a government survey -- to see if certain government securities should be withheld from the market. Plus a final promise to reduce federal spending personally -- by "impounding, postponing and freezing" government expenditures,
