One reason why Alaska is dependent on massive Federal aid - is the effect of the earthquake on the fishing industry. That is still the key industry in our forty-ninth state. Or - has been. Tonight - it's paralyzed. Boats, docks, canneries, warehouses, all along that south Alaskan Coast especially Prince Wm. Sound, shattered by the earthquake that struck on Friday night. I've just talked to Merrill Wein, in Alaska.

He has flown low over Anchorage and says it looks as though a giant plough had made great furrows across the heart of the city. And he said the Turnagain Arm top residential section is impossible to describe.

But, the Alaskans are a tough breed. And they are getting on with the job. Vowing that Anchorage will arise again - a handsomer city than ever. All are thankful that the death toll - less than one hundred - wasn't higher. By the law of averages, an earthquake of this magnitude should have taken a

toll - running into the thousands. It didn't, because so many people were at home - on Good Friday.

It certainly is odd to hear the word

"filibuster" connected with - Senator Hubert Humphrey.

The Minnesota Democrat long has been one of the strongest critics of the filibuster, specially with regard to - the Civil Rights Bill.

Always on hand at Blarney Castle to show visitors the Blarney Stone. For a bob - or maybe a pint at the local pub - Matt would hold your feet while you kissed the stone that confers eloquence. And then, he'd regale you with - Blarney, of course.

For fifty years he was at Blarney Castle.

Now dead in Cork at the age of ninety - Matt O'Shea,

keeper of the Blarney Stone.

And now Dick Noel, who really has something to be eloquent about!

Astronomical cosmic fireworks! Three-C,

One forty seven. A rather prosaic name - on the star

charts. No touch of poetry, as in those from Greek

mythology like Mars, Jupiter, Saturn - and so on.

But three-C, one forty-seven - is far more dramatic than the puny planets of our solar system.

Also it's farther out in pace - farther than any object we know about. Several billion light years - out in space. And moving away from us at a rate of - sventy-six thousand miles a second.

It's also exploding - like a gigantic Roman candle. And that's why astronomers have been able to photograph it with the two-hundred inch telescope at Mount Palomar in California.

Surely this space spectacular deserves a more colorful name - than three-C, one forty-seven.
