At Lagos, capital of Nigeria - the final act today. With a delegation of five Biafran leaders signing an official armistice. Pledging their total loyalty to the federal government of Nigeria in return for a promise of complete amnesty. Ending at last a two-and-a-half year rebellion - that acc cost the lives of an estimated two million.

Now begins - another battle; the battle against wide spread starvation that threatens anywhere from months three to five million. Both sides working together attempting to channel relief supplies into the areas where they are needed most. A giant task repeated to be supported mainly by the US, Britain, the International Red Cross, and the United Nations.

In cities and towns clear across the country millions of Americans paused in tribute today. In public and in private - each in his own way marking the forty-first anniversary of the birth of the late Mo Dr. He was that young.

Martin Luther King. The day's salute including a resolution passed typox by the Georgia House - in Doctor King's native Atlanta. A privileged resolution officially commemorating his birthday. Representatives Ben Brown - who sponsored the measure - observing that "many people disagreed" with the slain civil rights but leader, We added towers, that Dr. King "brought good to humanity - and pride and dignity to this area."
