BREZHNEV

From the White House comes an announcement that

President Nixon has just received a personal letter - from

Russia's Leonid Brezhnev. The Soviet leader expressing

"profound satisfaction" - at the signing of an agreement

"restoring peace in Vietnam." This - said he
"eliminating one of the most dangerous hotbeds of

international tensions;" also, clearing the way - for

"improving the world situation."

Brezhnev adding that this, too, "will have a positive effect" - on relations between the U.S. and Russia; in the process, opening "new possibilities" - for Soviet-American cooperation. The Soviet leader stating flatly: "We stand for such a policy."

Secretary of State William Rogers - a witness

today before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, There
expressing hope that the cease-fires in Vietnam and Laos will create "a momentum toward peace in Cambodia."

Conceding, however, that such has not been the case - at
least, up to now.

William Rogers also discussing the question - of

post-war aid to North Vietnam. Saying: "We will, of course,

make no commitment - without the support of Congress."

Adding: "We will ask for that support - only after the most

careful planning;" only "when conditions on the ground"
fully justify it.

In return, Committee Chairman Loday was

Fulbright, - pledging to help heal the divisions arising from

the war. Also, paying tribute to President Nixon - for

bringing about a general reduction in world tensions.

Adding that he now hopes to begin - "a new relationship"

with the State Department.

Tragedy in the Middle East. A Libyan jetliner

piloted by a French crew - somehow straying into Israeli

air space over the Occupied Sinai. Israeli jets
attempting to force the plane down. When that failed
shooting it down. The resulting crash - said to have killed

about seventy.

Israeli Premier Golda Meir - quickly expressing

"deep sorrow." Israel "regrets" - said she - "that the

pilot did not heed repeated warnings - which were given

him in accordance with international procedures."

On the Arab side, as might be expected - a sharp reaction. Cairo saying that Israel - "will be made to pay dearly." Adding that "Israel should be held completely responsible - for whatever this act may lead to."

All this following by just a few hours - an

Israeli reprisal raid deep into Lebanon. Israeli commandoes

- killing dozens of alleged Arab guerillas.

These - according to Israeli Foreign Minister Abba

Eban - "persons who were being trained and equipped to go

into the wide world and kill us." Today's action thus

"saved the lives of many" - he continued. Adding: "It

is part of the Israeli policy - of taking preventive action."

From the White House - another special radio address. President Nixon discussing today - the state of the nation's economy. Saying: "For the first time in nearly twenty years - we can look forward to genuine prosperity in a time of peace."

The President also noting that inflation last year "was cut nearly in half." Adding: "We expect to reduce it
even further - in Nineteen-Seventy-Three." "The

fundamental reason" - he continued - "is growing

opposition to big spending." "That will do more than anything
else" - said he - "to protect your family budget."

As for economic controls, the President saying:

"We would like Phase Three & to be as voluntary as

possible; but we will make it' - as mandatory as necessary."

The President going on to say: "If we act responsibly - this new prosperity can be ours for many years to come; if we don't, then as Franklin Roosevelt once

warned - we could be wrecked on the rocks of loose fiscal policy."

"The choice is ours" - he concluded - so "let us choose responsible prosperity."

LONDON

The value of the U.S. dollar continued to hold

firm today - in European money markets. The price of

gold - something else again; soaring to a record Seventy
Nine-Thirty-an-ounce - on the London bullion exchange.

One gold dealer saying: "It could break through the Eighty
Dollar barrier - before the weekend."

From Treasury Secretary George Shultz - an order today setting up a special new tax unit. Its main job - that of easing the tax problems of returned prisoners-of-war.

Meanwhile, the men who are already back - enjoying another series of homecomings. Navy Lieutenant Commander Joseph Plumb Janiar - arriving at the Great Lakes Naval Hospital near Chicago. "To say this is the happiest day in my life" - said he - is simply "insufficient."

A new so-called "morning-after" birth control

drug - called di-ethyl-stibestrol or DES - wift soon be
formally approved for public use. The announcement coming

today from Dr. Charles Edwards of the Food and Drug

Administration - in testimony before a Senate panel. Dr.

Edwards saying that DES has actually been found safe and

effective - when treatment is initiated up to three days

after exposure.

The doctor stressed, however, that DES - has "some immediate minor side reactions." Adding: "It should not be considered as a method for continuous birth control" - but for "emergency treatment only."
