Anchorage, Alaska: Commerce Secretary Maurice Stans today told Alaskans that Alaska's annual seal harvest in the Pribilof Islands - has become the target of a callous, continuing campaign of defamation;" replete with charges "that the government is decimating the herd - that the harvest is conducted with wanton cruelty." Not true said he. - Nothing could be further from the truth. Commerce Secretary Stans adding that the saga of the seals - is really "best described as a triumph of wild life management - a real conservation success story;" in that the killing is most humane and closely regulated - as shown by a seven fold increase in the seal herd.
