AUSTRIA.

THIS WAS A GALA DAY - IN VIENNA. ALL AUSTRIA - REJOICENG.

CHANGELLOR RAAB CAME HOME FROM MOSCOW. WELCOMED - WITH STATELY

CEREMONY AND POPULAR JUBILATION.

THE AIR PORT - JAMMED, WITH A CROWD OF THIRE THOUSAND.

INCLUDING THE AMBASSADORS OF THE BIG FOUR, GREAT BRITAIN, FRANCE,

THE UNITED STATES, SOVIET RUSSIA. OUTSIDE THE AIR PORT, THE HIGHWAY

- LINED WITH THE HUNDRED THOUSAND PEOPLE. HAILING THE CHANCELLOR

- FOR THE AGREEMENT HE CONCLUDED IN MOSCOW.

THE REASON FOR ALL THE REJOICING IS FOUND IN WORDS THE CHANCELLOR SPOKE INTO A MICROPHONE AT THE FLYING FIELD. "I THANK GOD THAT WE COULD ALL LIVE TO SEE THIS MOMENT," HE CRIED. "WHAT WE HAVE BEEN AWAITING FOR TEN YEARS HAS BEEN ACHIEVED. WE WILL BE FREE."

THE AGREEMENT, SIGNED IN MOSCOW BY CHANCELLOR RAAB AND FOREIGN WINISTER MOLOTOY, STATES THE TERMS OF A TREATY - WHICH BOTH AUSTRIA AND THE SOVIETS WILL PLAGE BEFORE THE WESTERN POWERS. FOR - AN O.K. THEN, IF ALL GOES WELL, A FORMAL TREATY WILL BE SIGNED.

THE SOVIET-AUSTRIAN TERMS, SETTLED IN MOSCOW, PROVIDE FOR

THE FULL INDEPENDENCE OF AUSTRIA, WITH THE REMOVAL OF ALL OCCUPATION TROOPS. THE RUSSIANS - TO SEND BACK ALL AUSTRIAN PRISONERS CAPTURED IN THE SECOND WORLD WAR. ECONOMIC PROVISIONS - CONCERNING, FOR EXAMPLE AUSTRIAN OIL FIELDS, AND - SHIPPING ALONG THE DANUBE.

BUT TERMS THAT PROVOK THE MOST THOUGHT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

COUNTRIES. NO FOREIGN POWER - TO HAVE MILITARY BASES IN AUSTRIAN
TERRITORY. IN OTHER WORDS, THE SMALL REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA WOULD

BE "NEUTRALIZED." A SORT OF BUFFER STATE - BETWEEN EAST AND WEST.

THESE TERMS SUGGEST A REASON WHY MOSCOW MADE A QUICK CHANGE OF POLICY. FOR TEN YEARS, THE SOVIETS HAD BLOCKED AND OBSTRUCTED AN AUSTRIAN PEACE TREATY. THEN, SUDDENLY, THE DECISION TO BRING ONE ABOUT, IN A HURRY.

IT SEEMS TO BE, AT LEAST IN PART - MANEUVER TO BLOCK THE
REARMAMENT OF WESTERN GERMANY. THAT'S INDICATED BY THE COMMUNISTS,
THEMSELVES.

TODAY, THE LONDON DAILY WORKER SAID - THERE'S NO REASON WHY A SIMILAR PEACE TREATY SHOULD NOT BE MADE WITH GERMANY.

AUSTRIA - NEUTRALIZED, WITHOUT ANY WESTERN CONNECTIONS. THE SOVIETS WOULD CERTAINLY LIKE TO HAVE GERMANY THAT WAY - NO ALLIANCE WITH THE WEST. NO WEST GERMAN ARMY - IN THE MILITARY FORCES OF NATO.

IT LOOKS AS IF THE SOVIETS MIGHT MEAN AN AUSTRIAN PEACE TREATY

- AS A TEMPTATION TO LURE THE GERMANS. DANGLING - THE PROSPECT OF

GERMAN INDEPENDENCE AND UNITY. BUT - AS A NEUTRAL COUNTRY, LIKE

AUSTRIA.

THE WESTERN REACTION TO THE MOSCOW ARRANGEMENT IS FAVORABLE

- BUT CAUTIOUS. LONDON, PARIS AND WASHINGTON - WAITING TO GET THE

OFFICIAL DETAILS. WASHINGTON, IN PARTICULAR, TAKES NOTE OF THE

POSSIBLE EFFECT - ON GERMANY. BUT, ON THE OTHER HAND, WE DO

WANT AN AUSTRIAN PEACE TREATY.

IN WEST GERMANY - CORDIAL APPROVAL. WEST GERMAN OFFICIALS - HAILING
THE AUSTRO-SOVIET AGREEMENT.

EDEN

TODAY, ANTHONY EDEN GAVE HIS FIRST RADIO BROADCAST - AS PRIME MINISTER. AT THE MICROPHONE, HE SAID: "I HAVE ASKED HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN TO GRANT A DISSOLUTION OF PARLIAMENT ON MAY 6, AND HER MAJESTY HAS BEEN PLEASED TO SIGNIFY HER ACCEPTANCE OF MY RECOMMEND-ATION."

THAT'S THE BRITISH WAY OF ANNOUNCING - GENERAL ELECTIONS.

EDEN CONTINUING - "POLLING WILL TAKE PLACE ON MAY TWENTY SIXTH."

THAT'S THE DATE WHEN THE BRITISH WILL CAST THEIR BALLOTS - ELECTING

A NEW PARLIAMENT.

THIS HAS BEEN EXPECTED EVER SINCE THE RETIREMENT OF PRIME MINISTER WINSTON CHURCHILL. EDEN, THE NEW PRIME MINISTER - PLACING HIS POLITICAL FATE IN THE HANDS OF THE BRITISH VOTERS.

THE CALLING OF AN ELECTION IS COMPLICATED BY A LONDON NEWSPAPER STRIKE - WHICH HAS TIED UP JOURNALISM FOR A WEEK. THE SUPPOSE THEY EXPECT THE CONDON STRIKE TO BE OVER BY ELECTION DAY THE TWENTY-SIXTH OF NEXT MONTH.

VOTERS IN GENERAL - DEMOCRATS AS WELL AS REPUBLICANS, WHOM WITH D

WARREN.

CHIEF JUSTICE EARLE WARREN, TODAY, DECLARED - HE WILL

NOT, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE, BECOME A CANDIDATE FOR PRESIDENT

OF THE UNITED STATES. HE SAID THIS IN A WRITTEN STATEMENT,

ISSUED AT THE OFFICES OF THE SUPREME COURT IN WASHINGTON. WHICH

BRINGS TO A QUICK END - A SORT OF MINOR BOOM, "WARREN FOR PRESIDENT."

THE REPUBLICANS, OF COURSE, HOPE THAT PRESIDENT EISENHOWER
WILL RUN AGAIN, NEXT YEAR. BUT THEY CAN'T BE SURE. SO, INEVITABLY
THERE'S TALK OF A POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVE CANDIDATE.

RECENTLY THE GALLUP POLL MADE SURVEY, ASKING REPUBLICAN

VOTERS - WHOM THEY'D PREFER, IF EISENHOWER IS NOT AVAILABLE.

THE RESULT - STRONGLY IN FAVOR OF EARLE WARREN. TWENTY-FIVE PER

CENT SAYING - THEY PREFER THE CHIEF JUSTICE. VICE PRESIDENT NIXON

CAME NEXT, WITH NINETEEN PER CENT. FORMER GOVERNOR THOMAS E

DEWEY - ELEVEN PER CENT.

THE GALLUP POLL FOLLOWED THIS WITH A SAMPLENG, WHICH QUERIED VOTERS IN GENERAL - DEMOCRATS AS WELL AS REPUBLICANS. WHOM WOULD THEY PREFER - EARLE WARREN OR ADLAI STEVENSON? THE RESULT CAME OUT with the Democrate ABOUT EVEN. SHOWING - THE CHIEF JUSTICE IS AS POPULAR AS THE TITULAR

HEAD OF THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY.

ALL OF WHICH INCREASED THE TALK OF CHIEF JUSTICE WARREN,

AS A POSSIBLE CANDIDATE. BUT THAT MADE NO MIT WITH EARLE WARREN.

TODAY HE SAID - IT EMBARRASSED HIM, IN HIS WORK ON THE SUPREME

Radclyffe Dugmore? At one time he was the most famous of early group that first took still and motion pictures of big game in Africa. Dugmore was also well known as a painter of animals, birds, mountains, and the sea. He was Milk a founder of the famous Explorers Club in New York, the world's number one society, institute and club, all relied in one, of the great explorers of our time.

I have just received word from Bournemouth, on the south coast of England, that Arthur Dugmore has gone on to the Elysian Fields, -- taken that final adventurous ride across the River Styx with Charen.

Hundreds of thousands of Americans should remember Years 0000

Dugmore. For they saw his first movies of big game in Africa, and heard him tell of his exciting experiences. That was Back in the period just before Martin Johnson, Carl Akeley and others became famous for their filming and for their travels in Central and East Africa.

Dugmore also was well known in America because he was one of the group of Britishers, wounded early in the war, sent over here by Lord Northcliffe to tell the British side of that story, and list American support. He was married to an American, and spent a considerable part of his life here and in Canada.

He made the first and only picture of the first long flight in the history of aviation -- when Orville Wright, in Nineteen Eight, at Fort Myer, managed to keep that famous Wright Box Kite in the air for fifty-five minutes.

Many years ago I wrote a biography of Arthur
Radclyffe Dugmore, entitled "Rolling Stone". It told of
his boyhood in a castle in Ireland, of his eccentric father
who thought the children could get a better education if he
bought a small sailing ship and they all lived at sea.
Young Arthur, at eighteen, was master of the seventy-eight
foot schooner, end with a crew of four, took her across the
Atlantic. He saved his father's life in a banana rebellion

in Honduras. And after that went on to adventures in the big game country of North America and Africa.

When he first went to Africa he had only a cumbersome old-fashioned still camera with heavy glass plates. His companion was a man who went on to fame in this country, Dr. James L. Clark of the American Museum of Natural History. And of all the unusual pictures they made, the most extraordinary, surely, was of a charging rhino. Dugmore stood his ground, behind his big box camera, as the rhino, charged straight toward him. He waited coolly, until it was exactly sixteen yards away, and filled the entire plate. Then he snapped the camera, and dove to one side, as the rhino hurtled by.

He spent his old age doing something not many men are able to do. Although he was not a man who had saved his money, he did keep on painting right down to the end, dying at the age of eighty-four.) Spending his final ten or twelve years painting and fishing in Ireland.

And that the final chapter in the story of The Rolling Stone.
