SHIPS

The pride of the Italian passenger fleet - the

luxury liner Andrea Doria is at the bottom of the Atlantic

tonight - but virtually all her seventeen hundred

passengers and crew are safe in New York, or on their

way to safety aboard rescue vessels.

So far as the coast guard can determine - five lives were lost, six persons seriously injured, and scores treated for shock and bruises.

The 29-million-dollar Italian liner - one of the word's most beautifully appointed ships - received her mortal blow from the Swedish-liner, Stockholm, 45 miles south of Nantucket, Massachusetts around midnight - during a night so foggy that visibility was almost zero and for some reason that most modern radar failed to warn of the impending crash.

The Andrea Doria began to list immediately -

thousands of gallons of water pouring into her side
where the Stockholm had ripped her open. A few lifeboats
got away - but most passengers climbed down Jacob's
ladders into boats sent over from the Stockholm and
from a half dozen other ships that hurried to the scene
- among them, the French line's "Ile De France".

## DILWORTH

ONE OF THE MOST VIVID REPORTS OF THE ACCIDENT CAME
FROM MAYOR RICHARDSON DILWORTH OF PHILADELPHIA--A PASSENGER
ON THE ANDREA DORIA. HE AND HIS WIFE WERE RESCUED AND TAKEN
ABOARD THE ILE DE FRANCE.

THE MAYOR TOLD REPORTERS BY SHORT-WAVE RADIO FROM THE FRENCH LINER: "IT WAS A PERFECTLY HARROWING EXPERIENCE. I WAS SOUND ASLEEP WHEN THE SHIPS COLLIDED, AND WE DIDN'T KNOW WHAT HAD HAPPENED AT FIRST.

BUT THE PASSENGERS AND CREW OF THE ANDREA DORIA WERE ADSOLUTELY AMAZING. Then he added !-

IT WASNT A MATTER, OR AN OCCASION, FOR PERSONAL HEROISM. EVERYONE WAS CALM.

FOR THE FIRST COUPLE OF HOURS, WE DIDN'T SEE ANY
RESCUE SHIPS AROUND US, AND WHEN THE SHIP BEGAN LEANING
CRAZILY, EVERYONE TRIED TO GET AS HIGH AS POSSIBLE. BUT IT
WAS NO GOOD TRYING TO GET FROM ONE PLACE TO ANOTHER ON THE
SHIP BECAUSE OF THE WAY IT WAS LISTING. TO DO SO, ONE HAD TO
CRAWL OR HANG ONTO SOMETHING AND DRAG HIMSELF ALONG."

"THEN, "MAYOR DILWORTH CONTINUED, "LIFE BOATS WERE
LOWERED FROM THE LEE SIDE--THE VESSEL WAS LISTING TO STARBOARD,
I THINK ABOUT SIX BOATS GOT AWAY AND IT WAS WOMEN AND CHILDREN
FIRST. BUT AFTER THAT, NO MORE BOATS COULD GET AWAY."

"AFTER THE LIFE-BOATS HAD BEEN LAUNCHED, AND NO MORE COULD BE LAUNCHED, EVERYONE WANTED, WINDLESS TO GET AS HIGH UP ON THE SHIP AS POSSIBLE--BUT STILL, THERE WAS NO PANIC."

"AND"--THE MAYOR "HOURE "IT WAS AMAZING, WHEN YOU CONSIDER THAT A WEEK LARGE PERCENTAGE OF THE PASSENGERS AND CREW WERE OVER 40 YEARS OLD--AT LEAST HALF OF THEM."

"BUT THEY WERE CALM, EVEN WHEN THEY HAD TO FACE THE JACOB'S HORROR OF LOOKING DOWN THOSE/DICKENDERS TO THE SEA."

"I CAME THRU THIS FINE, BUT MY WIFE SUFFERED A

TERRIBLE CRACK OVER THE EYE, " SAID THE PHILADELPHIA MAYOR.

THATS THE ACCOUNT FROM MAYOR DILWORTH OF PHILADELPHIA.

Inevitably - the accident is being compared to history's worse maritime disaster in time of peace - the sinking of the Titanic in 1912. Again - a foggy night - a luxury liner speeding thru the North Atlantic - suddenly - an object dead ahead - the sharp command to the ship - but too late - the great liner rammed a giant ice-berg with crushing impact.

The loss - 15 hundred lives.

But this time - last night - nearly everyone saved by the quick action of the ships crews involved, and those rushing to the scene.

But still with a loss of \$ 5 lives, and a 30-million dollar ship - the pride of the Italian fleet.
