Purpose? To prove their boast - that the
majority of Vietnamese people stand firmly behind them．

To demonstrate mass civilian backing－of their fight against
government and American military forces．

> Result? A stunning blow -- to Communist
prestige．Business as usual in towns and villages throughout
the country－as the appointed hour came and went without incident．The so－called strike－＂a oomplete fiasco＂，So said U $S$ officials．

The whole incident regarded by many－as the closest thing to exaction a national referendum，th the twenty years－that the communists have been trying to take over the country．
in Washington -- to the Castro government in Havana, th an effort to speed an agreement - for the orderly movement
of Cuban refuges. At the same time, calling attention to the potential perils - in permitting a "freedom shuttle" to Florida by small boat.

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A later report to the effect, that Cuba is now making an effort to establish orderly procedures - for the dux departure of refugees; And further is trying to discourage them - from sailing in small boats.

Nevertheless, three more of the tiny craft taine nogotiatap LeEamimge, the wind-swept Florida straits today; two moreare reported on the way, th the continuing exodus - from Castro Cuba. They just can't wait - to get out.
At the United Nations - A Cuban charge today
that Puerto Rico is "a stunted nation". Cuban Foreign Minister Raul koa - demanding immediate freedom for Puerto Rico. Because, said he, "it is the voice of Cuba not the United States - that expresses the will of the Puerto Ricans."

The U S reply by Arthur Goldberg - simply this:That Puerto Ricans have had the opportunity of repeated 48 free elections - to decide their own future; which is more than Fidel Castro - has ever offered the Cubans.

JOHNSON

Another milestone today -- in the recovery of President Johnson, marked by the following incident:

The First Lady and a group of Washington dignitaries -taking part in a tree-planting ceremony in honor of the President -- outside his hospital window. When the President
-- who had been up most of the night -- walked to the windown and called down: "You all go on and plant that tree so I can go back to sleep."

The sleepless night caused by continued pain -- from his operation. But the President's overall progress -- "continuing satisfactorily," says the hospital. And his out-the-window remark -- if we're to belleve the doctors -- just a sign that he's getting well.

At the Vatican - the Ecumenical Council today
gave final endorsement - to that historic church document
on anti-semitism; A firm declaration once and for allthat Jews should never be held as $\begin{gathered}\text { scapegoats for the the } \\ \text { sefmpeb }\end{gathered}$ crucifixion. Further deploring "hatred, persecutions and displays of anti-Semitism-directed against Jews at any time and by anyone."

Announcement of the final vote - applauded bro
vigorously by the world-wide assembly of Catholic prelates.
QuA Hailed by the American Jewish committee - as "a significant event in the history of Jewish and Christian relations."

Three Arabs were killed and a native policeman seriously injured -in renewed anti-British rioting today at Seikh othamn, Second biggest city - in the British protectorate of Aden.
The rioting touched off by reports - of police
brutality; Two suspected members of the Adenese
Nationalist Front - said to have been tortured to death.

Police denying the rumors - but forced to call on the help
of British troops - before they could anal the violence.

The British later ordering an immediate curfew -
in Sikh Othamn. Many of the demonstrators - thus
adjourning to neighboring crater town; for a second demonstration demanding immediate British withdrawal and surrender of Aden to the Yemeni Republic.

From Jakarta - news today of Indonesia's
first outright riot - against a facility of Red China. Some five hundred Moslem demonstrators - attacking and burning the Chinese run Republic University. Titer hand-to-hand fighting with a hundred students - that put about fifteen of them in the hospital.

Police and soldiers following the demonstrators
into the university grounds -- but making no attempt to interfere. Later arresting four students - none of the demonstrators.

In the meantime, a peaceful march by some
five thousand Moslem and christian students -- on the semi-official national front office; Where they demanded that Sukarno ban the Communist party -- and put to death party leader D. N. Adit. x more easily demanded than done.

At last rumor-Aidit said to ie hiding in the Red Chinese Embassy at Kuala Lumpur -- in neighboring Malaysia.
