## SUBSTITUTE PACIEIC R. . - Sunder. Free day, july $25,1944$.

The news from Guam tells of a junction of
a linking wa up of two beachheads, From each of these, one on the north and thepther on the south, American troops drove toward each other along the short and were aided by a stupendous bombardment from sea and sky. Warships stood off the coast and hurled ponderous salvos against the Japanese positions that separated the two American beachheads, while the bombers collaborated with tons of their own high explosive. The Japs were pounded so heavily that, when the curtain of fire was raised, American ground forces were able to drive through and meet each other - linking the beachheads.

We have figures tonight for American casualties
in Guam thus far - three-thousand-and-eighteen. Four hundred and forty-three killed, two thousand -three-hundred-and-sixty-six wounded, and two hundred and nine missing in action. The Japs have lost twenty-four hundred killed - that many counted for only part of the total.

On Tinian Island nearby, the Japs have been waking wild counter-attacks. The Marines today captured Ushi Point Flying Field, after beating back crazy charges by the enemy. Shortly before dawn this morning, the Japs rushed in with wild yells and screams and a waving of Samara Swords. They were simply mowed down. The story is told in figures - casualty figures, on Tinian Island we have loft fifteen killed and two hundred and twenty-five wounded, while thirteen hundred and tienty-four Japanese dead have been counted.

In New Guinea, the story still concerns the fore of twenty-five thousand Japs who were trapped weeks ago by a flanking move, one of those brilliant Macarthur amphibious operations. Ever since then the Japs have been trying to break out of the trap, making incessant attacks. All have been repelled, and tonight's Macarthur manx communique informs us that the trapped enemy force is now retreating, pulling inland, away from the coast, trying to get organized for another attempt to break out, presumably.

## CHINA

In China that city of Hengyang is still holding out, the isolated Chinese garrison still beating off Japanese assaults. Rhixngking Chungking declares that, as a result of the bitter resistance at Hengyang, the Japanese drive in haman Hunan Province has been checked the enemy offensive designed to seize the railroad from Hankow to Canton and thereby cut China in two.

The Rod Army tonight is driving to the gates of Warsaw. $\sqrt{\text { Moscow dispatches state that horse-riding- }}$ Cossaks are speeding across the Polish plains, drawing neat to the Polish capital. At the same time, a story from Madrid relates that the German command is evacuating Warsaw.

The Russian sweep across the Polish plains has outstripped the more methodical progress of the troops attacking the key fortresses of Lvov andrest-Litovsk.

Tonight's late dispatch from Moscow states that the Russians have broken into the city of Lvov, where savage street fighting is going on. And earlier we heard that the mighty fortress of Brest-Litovsk was now under Russian fiege.

Every bit of news from the eastern front
eaphasizes the dizzy pix pace of the Russian advance,
and gives indications of a German rout - the Hitler
forces broken and fleeing. Of course e must expect they are retiring in some fashion or other to make a stand. Either that, or they must launch a counterattack

The mere surface appearance of utter disaster must be to some extent deceptive. If it isn't, the Russians are on their way into Germany - and the European war is in its final stages.

The dews $\boldsymbol{\Lambda}^{\text {tells }}$ of what apparently constitutes the final break between Soviet Russia and the exiled government of Poland. Moscow announced today that the Red army has begun what Moscow calls: "the liberation of the brotherly Polish people". This liberation takes the form of establishing the authority of the Polish group in Moscow, the mans newly formed Polish committee of liberation, which supports the policies of Stalin.
(The Russians announced that as they occupy polish territory, they are recognizing the committee as the legal civil authority.

This Moscow Polish committee has previously
denounced the exiled Polish government in London in the bitterest of terms. At the same time, the exiled government calls the committee "a puppet". Today the Polish Ambassador in "ashineton used these words "a typical puppet government imposed by Moscow". And Polish sources declare that Stalin is applying to Poland the policy of unconditional surrender.

## HITLER

It may be that, when History is written, one headline event of today will be marked down as the beginning of the final stage of the downfall of the Nazi Monster. I mean - that latest decree issued by Hitler, which orders the mobilization of everything in Germany and in the conquered countries, every human being and every material thing, for the purpose of war. It's all out now in the final desperate struggle of the cornered Nazi. Which is not surprising. The logic of things indickaqes that a condemned outfit like Hitler;s gangsters would grab everything and make the most ruthless use of it, for a merciless convulsion as doom approaches; trying to drag everything into the last fight, before they perish.

These latest developments in Naziland were
touched off by the revolt of the Junkers, the attempt by the Generals to assassinate Hitler and overthrow the Nazi Regime. The first answer to that was the creation of a Dictator for suppression - Himmler, the Master Murderer, with absolute powers of life and death in

$\longrightarrow$ suppression, has now added a GoeringGoebbels Dictatorship for the forcing of everything into the Nazi Y ar- thus organizing for the final desperate struggle against doom, a battle which may be waged inside Germany itself.

A follow-up to the story of the Generals'
revolt comes in a dispatch from London- stating that Field Marshal vo Busch has committed suicide. He was one of the leading Commanders on the Eastern Front and is said to have been one of the Generals in the plot to kill Hitler and overthrow the Nazis. Word comes from the Polish Underground, that Non Busch, just Before his final act, sent a telegram to Hitler stating that the German Military situation was hopeless, and urging that the war be ended at once.

Another High German General linked to the Anti-Nazi Movement There certainly are a lot of them ! especially if you count the High German Commanders made prisoners by the Russians. They constitute one

British veterans state that they have never known the Germans to fight so bitterly, so stubbornly, folding every position xt to the last. This might seem to argue top-notch morale - rather unexpected, after the Prussian

Today we have a new meaning applied to
that familiar phrase - the dogs of war. We are told of a new use to which faithful fido is being put in battle, a new branch of the canine service. Pooches called - "M" Dogs. "M" standing for - Mine, land mines that the enemy lays. These are one of the most preplexing dangers that our troops have to face in driving forward against the Nazis - fields of landmines that blow up when stepped on. It' is a ticklish job to detect them, a task that is usually done with an electrical device. This works with mines made of retals, but the cunning Nazi also uses explosive traps made of wood, which do not have any electrical effect. So now the latest - "M" doge.

These we are told have been developed by the Quartermaster's Corps, which devised a way to train the dogs.
