BANGKOG PENTAGON

As promised last week, Washington and Bangkok today announced plans - for massive

U.S. troop withdrawals from Thailand. The first phase of the U.S. pullout - to be

completed by June; and the remaining U.S. troops to follow.

The Pengaton adding that over Thai objections, it will also bring back - more than a hundred U.S. craft flown to Thailand by South Vietnamese trefugies.
