IDEAL PACKED POWDER, AND BLAZING SUNSHINE. WEATHER SO GLORIOUS THESE WINTER
GAMES ARE RUNNING IN THE BLACK -- WONDER OF WONDERS. GROUSING ? YOU NEVER
HEAR ANY. EVEN THE WINTER HATING NEWSMEN - A THOUSAND OR MORE OF THEM FROM THE
FLATLANDS, ARE ALL SMILES AND ENTHUSIASM. IF THE WINTER OLYMPICS WERE TO LAST
ANOTHER TWO WEEKS I BELIEVE ALL THE NEWSMEN, AND PRENTICE HALE AND AVERY BRUNDAGE,
WOULD BE ON SKIS. THAT WOULD BE SOMETHING !

TODAY AT SQUAW.

AMERICA -- THE U.S.A. -- CAME WITHIN A TENTH OF A SECOND OF ANOTHER GOLD MEDAL TODAY. IT WAS BY THAT HAIRY MARGIN A RED ARMY LIEUTENANT, EUGENI GRISHIN EQUALLED HIS OWN WORLD RECORD IN THE 500 METER SPEED SKATING RACE. 27 YEAR OLD BILL DISNEY OF ALHAMBRA, CALIFORNIA, CAME THAT CLOSE. THE TOUGH RUSSIAN SYSTEM OF TRAINING PAID OFF. FIVE GOLD MEDALS SO FAR FOR THE USSR.

THIS WAS THE BIG DAY FOR THE AUSTRIAN SKIERS. THE DAY OF THE SLALOM, DOWN STEEP KT 22. TO USE A BROMIDE, IT WAS A RACE OF THRILLS AND SPILLS - HEARTBREAKING SPILLS. WILLY BOGNOR, WHO LED ON THE FIRST RUN BY A FULL SECOND, CRACKED UP ON THE SECOND RUN AND DIDN'T FINISH. CHICK IGYAYA, GOING ALL OUT FOR JAPAN, THE EMPEROR AND THE NEW PRINCE, HAD A SPECTACULAR SPILL THAT PUT HIM OUT OF THE RUNNING.

THE WINNER, ERNST HINTERSEER, A 28 YEAR OLD AUSTRIAN FARMER. WINNING THE SILVER MEDAL, HIS COUNTRYMAN, MATHIAS LEITNER. THIRD - CHARLES BOZON, OF FRANCE. KYUNG SOON YIM OF KOREA CAME IN LAST, AGAIN. HE SPILLED ALL OVER THE MOUNTAIN, BUT KEPT ON COMING - GETTING MORE APPLAUSE THAN ANYONE.

EISENHOWER

President Eisenhower arriving in Rio at Carnival time, for the beginning of the Rio Mardi Gras. The president of the United States, receiving - the wildest ovation in Rio's history. Crowds so dense - the motorcade took fifteen minutes to move three blocks through a blizzard of confetti raining down from Rio's famed skyscrapers. The buildings, decorated with American and Brazilian flags, and giant pictures of President Eisenhower. The President, standing and waving while Rio's millions chanted "Viva Ike!" and "We like Ike!"

Formally welcomed to Rio which is still Brazil's capitol President Kubitschek ~~xxx~~referred to his guest as - "The untiring worker for world peace."

Gronchi - refusing to accept the resignation - for the
moment.
