The caravan had hardly crossed the state line before it picked up an escort of forty-three police cars. escort, stocking close all the way to New Orleans. Freedom riders That's what the police thought. They when they are a discover that they were escorting - salesmen, out peddling magazines. A field detachment, based on Los Angeles - out to sell magazines in Dixie. The Louisianans just assumed they were a new group - of freedom riders. So no questions were asked. until the caravan had been escorted - right down to New Orleans. Forty-three patrol cars, guarding - a top of party of magazine salesmen.

TRACTORS

The "tractors for men" deal continues to cause heated debate on Capitol Hill; should we send Castro five hundred tractors in exchange for twelve hundred prisoners of war? Senator Frank Lausche answers with - a resounding "no". The Ohio Democrat, calling the deal - "abject surrender to Castro." While Humphrey of Minnesota calls it, in his words - "a major disaster for the Cuban regime." Along with him is the head of our Information Agency.
