- a visitor today at the White House. President Johnson
taking advantage of the occasion - to observe that "a
fresh breeze of hope is circulating around the world."

A hope - said he - that "an honorable peace will come"that the need for a U S military presence in Vietnam will eventually "diminish and disappear."

Lest there be any doubt though - the President language reassuring Kittikachorn, asserting that the United States will remain ever-committed - to the pursuit of human freedom in SoutheastnAsia.

Across the Atlantic - in Paris - preliminary

peace talks are still set to begin Friday. US officials

-- already on hand, Kwaiting only the arrival of North

Vietnamese delegates - who are making a brief stopover

tonight in Moscow.

In the meantime - DeGaulle is said to be keeping in close touch - with both Hanoi and Washington. Lending additional weight to a statement today & by DeGaulle's chief cabinet spokesman - Information Minister Georges Gorse; who said that if the preliminary talks "are successful - they will be expanded immediatel; into full-scale peace talks."

Pope Paul is coming again to the new world.

Announcement today - from the Vatican. The Pontiff saying he will fly to Colombia in August - to attend a world eucharistic Congress at Bogota; also tax to open a general conference of Latin American Bishops - immediately following.

This the Pontiff's sixth trip abroad - also his longest; with the full journey - expected to cover more than eleven thousand miles. It will also mark the first time to a Pope has ever visited South America.

Indeed, doctors briefly considered the transplanting the heart - into still another patient.
