Good evening everybody.

Four American airmen were released unharmed in

Turkey late today - after being held since Thursday by anti-
government terrorists. Their kidnappers had threatened to
kill the Americans unless Four-Hundred thousand dollars
ransom was paid by Saturday. But now they are back in their billets in Ankara - all four in good condition. U.S.

Ambassador William Handley says he is happy that reason has
prevailed and a senseless tragedy has been averted. Secretary
of State Rogers issued a statement in Washington, expressing
"great satisfaction with the vigorous and extraordinary efforts
of the Turkish government in connection with the case!'


## Court aleamored today an important verdict. Ruling that

two Lithuanians - a father and hon son who hijacked
a Soviet airliner last fall - are subject to extradition back Sound
to Russia. This tantamount to a death sentence - woman geld
inasmuch as the pair killed a stewardess - and Soviet officials
have demanded "appropriate" punsihment.

However, Turkey's Foreign Office - quick to point
out that Turkey has no extradition treaty with the Soviet
Union. Adding, in the final analysis, |"it will be up to the government $\{$ whether to hand over the hijackers to Russia or not."

Red China's Premier Chou En-Lai - has paid a surprise visit to Communist North Vietnam. The Chinese leader quoted as telling the North Vietnamese - that "China and Vietnam are tightly united like lips and teeth." Adding that the Chinese people will "resolutely support the resistance war of the Vietnamese people - until total victory." Also, that Red China has made adequate preparations for continued US war efforts in Southeast Asia. Exactly what that means is a matter of speculation.

Communist truck traffic⿴in Laos, just beyond the reach of that present Allied thrust - is said to have increased sharply. However, the Communist traffic - heading North rather than South; which could indicate - preparations for a possible Communist counteroffensive in Laos. Allied sources admitting though - as yet, they really don't know.
Here at home - a defense tor of that South

Vietnamese incursion into Laos./Secretary of state Rogers telling a VFW conference: "There was no reason legally or morally - why the North Vietnamese should have had safe haven" inside Laos.

Rogers also suggested, by inference, $\{$ that
he would not oppose - a South Vietnamese invasion of Communist North Vietnam. The Secretary saying there is "no reason why the South Vietnamese - as strong as they are,

- should be under any restrictions militarily." And he added:
"If you conduct a war in which the only action you can take is
defensive - then you" place yourself "at the mercy
of the enemy."

CAIRO FOLLOW ANKARA


Both the Arabs and Israelis - continuing to
observe the terms of their truce agreement; even though it
expired officially


The Kremlin
reportedly telling Cairo: "Don't shoot - at least, not yet."
The Israelis - reacting accordingly.
But how long will it last?/That's the big question. Indeed, Egypt invoking tonight fa partial blackout in the city of Cairo. And with both sides on full alert - at least one Western diplomat is quoted as saying: "Anything could set it off now f the sonic boom of a pas ing planefor an accidental gunshot anying."

KARACHI FOLLOW CALCUTTA

The death toll from political violence in East Pakistan

- now estimated at nearly Two-Hundred. That's according
to an official broadcast originating at Karachi in West

Pakistan. Unofficially though, on-scene observers placing
the count - at more like three hundred; adding that it could go - much higher.

## Both Britain and West Germany have indicated concern

over the possibility of civil war in Pakistan.

At Calcutta in India's West Bengal state - another
two deaths today; raising the overall toll to seventy-four with two days yet to go in India's ten-day national polling process.

Along the way, India's ruling Congress Party accused of permitting a "reign of terror." This according to a Congress Party splinter group - which calls itself the Bangla Congress. Observers noting, however, that India's Marxist Communist Party - has been accused of committing although
much of the violence; of constant attacks - from


India's version of
the Red Guards.

Min Elsewhere in Washington - another Monday - another. lasewhere in Wasinington
bigdecicion today at the U.S. Supreme Court. Including a refusal to grant conscientious objector status - to man
opposed to a specific war, such as Vietnam. Justice Thurgood Marshall asur that the Selective Service Law exempts only persons "who oppose participation in all war."

The High Court also let stand - a lower court ruling
that the film - "I Am Curious (Yellow)"-is obscene. This
by virtue of a tie vote - four-to-four; with Justice William Douglas $\downarrow$ disqualifying himself.

In still another case - the Supreme Court barring
job promotion tests - based on questions unrelated to the work to be performed. One such question asking whether the
words "adopt" and "adept" - have similar or contradictory meanings, or neither. And thus held to be a violation - of the Nineteen-Sixty-Four Civil Rights Act.

> On Capitol Hill - an attempt today to take advantage of the old adage - that "money talks." The Senate offering a reward of One Hundred Thousand Dollars - for information leading to the arrest and conviction of whoever it was that bombed the Capitol last week.

This by the authority of State Democratic Leader

Mike Mansfield - and his Republican counterpart, Hugh Scott; who said the reward money had come from a wealthy donor as yet unnamed.

They also announced that the Capitol police force

- will now become fully professionalized; which means,
- no more patronage.
