GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

There was an important meeting at the White "ouse today - to discuss the problem of inter-service rivalry.

President Eisenhower, calling in - his top military and civilian advisers, telling them he wants an end to - the bickering between Army and Air Force. That question - which service has the best missile? The Army, defending its Nike-Hercules. The Air Force, just as sure about its - Bomarc.

At the White "ouse today - the President and his advisers talked over a master plan for air defense. A master plan that would, among other things - decide that missile controversy.

This meeting, the high spot of - a full work day

for President Eisenhower. After which, he flew to Atlantic

City - for tonight's address before the American Medical

Association.

The Geneva conference has reached the stage of ultimatum and crisis. The ultimatum - drawn up by the West,
and handed to Gromyko. Britain, France and America telling
him - either come to an agreement on Berlin, or forget about
that summit conference. The minimum demand by the West - a
Soviet guarantee of our rights in West Berlin.

The crisis - a twenty-four hour delay, requested by Gromyko. The Soviet Foreign Minister - consulting Khrushchev.

If Gromyko doesn't return to the conference table with some real proposals - it's likely the Foreign Ministers will break up. With nothing accomplished.

Most Western diplomats in Geneva believe - that's how the Geneva conference will end.

The all Communist session in Moscow is over.

Khrushchev and the East German leaders said to have reached full agreement - as why shouldn't they? Do puppets ever talk back - when at the Kremlin?

No details revealed. But the key subject was that much talked about separate peace treaty between
Russia and East Germany.

The French plan for Nato - turned down by Nato.

DeGaulle's representative in London proposing - global strategy, instead of regional planning. The six hundred delegates - saying "No" to that.

The point is, that DeGaulle wants a bigger rose for France in the international organization. And he demands - full sharing of atomic secrets.

Following this negative vote in the Nato Council - the French are accusing Britain and America - of taking an anti-French line.

In West Germany, a political battle is shaping up over Chancellor Adenauer's decision to stay on. The Minister of
Economics - attacking the decision. Ludwig Erhard, telling
newsmen - he's angry, because the Chancellor never said anything
to him about it. Erhard, returning from America - learning of
Adenauer's turn-about when he saw the newspaper headlines.

Erhard, popular choice of the Christian Democratic

Party - to succeed Adenauer. Now preparing to challenge

Adenauer - for the leadership of the party. And maybe for the job of - Chancellor of West Germany.

All Cubans who own more than a thousand acres ()
ordered to file a report within ninety days. This, the latest
in - Castro's land reform. The Premier of Cuba, threatening to
prosecute - anyone who refuses.

Pinar del Rio Province. That's the center of opposition - to his policy of redistributing the land. The leader of the anti-Batista revolution, promising to use his personal popularity - to stifle the criticism that is becoming louder every day.

MILTON EISENHOWER

An Eisenhower will accompany Vice-President Nixon on his trip to Moscow. Dr. Milton Eisenhower, the President's
brother - head of Johns Hopkins. Milton Eisenhower, to be an
adviser - on our Moscow exhibit. Will he go on to Siberia with the Vice-President? No word on that yet.

The United Steel Workers will return to - separate bargaining with each steel company. So announced by the head of the Union, David MacDonald - who charges that steel management is trying to provoke a strike.

MacDonald says he'll continue meeting with Conrad

Cooper - spokesman for the twelve companies. But the Union

leader describes bimself as "pessimistic." He doubts the

possibility that anything can be achieved - this week. So he's

scheduling separate talks - beginning a week from today.

Cooper retorts - the Union is holding up progress.

Not making specific proposals - for a new contract.

SUBMARINE

The U.S. Navy calls its new submarine - "the deadliest ship ever built." The "George Washington," length - three hundred and eighty feet, dead weight - five thousand tons, cost - ten million.

What's so special - about this sub? The "George Washington" is armed with - Polaris missiles. Sixteen 2-stage rockets - carrying nuclear warheads, and can fire them while submerged, hit a target fifteen hundred miles away. "The deadliest ship ever built."

SOUTH AFRICA

More segregation - in South Africa. Apartheid - as it's known in Capetown. Meaning - strict separation of the races.

Today the Capetown Parliament - passed a university bill, Calling for white students to attend - white colleges only. Colored students, to be cantixfan confined to what are labeled - "all-black colleges."

During the debate - a crowd of European women demonstrated outside the Parliament building. Wearing black sashes - to symbolize their opposition to Apartheid. Protesting against the university bill which the lawmakers of South Africa passed, by an overwhelming majority.

That explosion at Hiroshima, Japan - destroyed a powder magazine of the old Imperial Army. Thousands of tons of ammunition - stored in a cave of Mt. Sarayama. The cache of explosives - standing there ever since World War Two.

Suddenly erupting. The blast - tearing right through the side of Mt. Sarayama. Destroying dozens of homes - on the slope of that mountain. Damaging - hundreds more. The toll - a hundred and thirteen injured. Miraculously, no one killed - when Hiroshima's arsenal of the Imperial Army went up in an inferno of flame and smoke.

Committee two weeks ago. The judges ruling Chiang Kai-shek's

The Committee, reading it - then rejecting it. Reason - the form uses the word "China" instead of "Formosa." The Nationalist Chinese, styling themselves - " the Republic of China Olympic Committee." A title the EX International Committee - refuses to recognize.

We are always hearing stories about - the farmer's daughter. From Naples comes the story of - the farmers' wives - and "the potato price riot."

Neapolitan "Murphys" as we used to call them, selling for lira equivalent to half a cent a pound. The farmers sore - and the farmers' wives going into action.

Today fifty senoras - attacked the local market, storming in - knocking down clerks who got in their way.

The clerks, rescued by the police. Tonight, the irate ladies of Naples are still in possession of the market.

Firing a barrage of potatoes at anyone who approaches.

Duck, Don - there comes a big one that must be from ldaho.

In the Canadian Arctic - more evidence of how the Twentieth Century is moving in and changing one of the oldest cultures - on our planet.

An Eskimo magazine! Its first issue! The name of the magazine: - "Inuktitut" - meaning "the Eskimo way." The pages, mimeographed on a special typewriter - that writes the Eskimo language. The magazine, edited entirely by Eskimos. *ts correspondents all people of the Polar Rim. The contents - devoted exclusively to stories of the Far North. Arctic stories all about adventures and walrus and polar bear hunts - and so on. Here's to "Inuktitut"! - Long may it flourish under the lights of the aurora borealis. Long may it be read in the igloos of Baffin and Elsmereland!
