"As a free man", said President Kennedy

today in Berlin - and he said it in German - "I am a

Berliner". Because all free men, wherever they live
are citizens of Berlin. The President, again

underlining a dominant theme of all his speeches in

Germany - that America does not intend to back out of

its commitments in Europe. Mr. Kennedy indirectly

telling De Gaulle that the American commitment to

Europe is absolute, and - will be honored to the limit.

The Berliners - loved it. Almost a quarter of a million of them - jammed into the square below the city hall, to give President Kennedy the greatest ovation - he has ever had.

Perhaps the atmosphere on both sides of the wall dividing Berlin is summed up by two newspaper

headlines. One in West Berlin reading - "Berlin welcomes John F. Kennedy". One in East Berlin reading - "Berlin awaits Khrushchev". West Berlin welcoming Kennedy. East Berlin - awaiting Khrushchev.

The East German editor, apparently a bit apprehensive - about the kind of reception the boss of the Kremlin is going to get. Will it come anywhere near West Germany's enthusiasm for the American President?

When Scottand regains her independence from England - as all good Scottish Nationalists say she will - there may be three versions of the Stone of Scone.

The famous red sandstone Stone of Scone, which at the moment lies under the coronation chair in Westminster Abbey - was put there by the English; when they stole it from the Scots in twelve-ninety-six - after an Englsh victory. It was there till nineteenfifty - when it was stolen back again by some Scottish Nationalists, from whom it was later recovered - and returned to Westminister Abbey.

Now a group of Scottish Nationalists say the stone returned to the Abbey in nineteen-fifty-one - is false. The real stone, hidden till that happy day when it will travel to Edinburgh - capital of an independent Scotland.

But the Scots, as you know - are rugged individualists. Not content with one Nationalist Party - they must have two. This second party says - it has the stone. Which is not - red sandstone. But - basalt;

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now hidden in - the Scottish hills.

Three coronation stones - waiting for a Scottish coronation, when a new Black Douglas or Robert the Bruce comes out of the Highlands.
