Republican leaders in Congress are calling on

President Kennedy - to show the Russians an example of firmness. The G O P arguing - that negotiations with Khrushchev appear to be we a waste of time. And that suggests Lave a change of strategy. What the Republicans call - "vigorous moves". For example - a deadline on the atomic test talks, to prevent Khrushchev from dragging them out indefinitely.

The Republicans claim khark that the safety of America demands - a return to the old time leadership.

The kind that we got from General Eisenhower - in the crisis involving Iran, Lebanon, Guatemala, and Matsu.

That is: if we act now to strengthen the fa defenses of matter next door to that matter of Southeast Asia, bordering Laos. So testified today - by Secretary of Defense McNamara. The Secretary had just finished telling the House Foreign Affairs Committee - about the equipment and training that Viet Nam needs.

One member of the Committee asked - "do you think South Viet Nam is going to stand?"

**Train: "I do."

The Communist advance in Laos evidently is not as important - as we thought last night. The dispatches told of - Padong overwhelmed by Red infantry.Government forces - pulling back ten miles. But tonight Vientiane reports - detachments of the Laotian Army still holding out at Padong; aided by - Meo tribesmen from the Laotian hills. The Meo's are an aboriginal - pre-Chinese race; similar to the Lolos in Western China.

There's one especially heartening thing - about this Vientiane dispatch. It says that morale in the Laotian Army - is high. Officers and men, putting up a stubborn fight - against the Communist guerrillas.

The loyalist forces dug in - vowing to stay where they are; asking only that they receive adequate arms - to match the enemy arms supplied by Russia and Red China.

The slightly brighter picture in Laos - doesn't change anything in Geneva. The Reds - are still shooting.

Still violating Khrushchev's pledge - to work for a genuine cease fire. Hence, the refusal of the western delegates - to return to the conference table. Britain, France, and the United States, pointing out 7 it's impossible to talk peace with an opponent who won't stop the war.

In Washington, President Kennedy frankly admittedhe's disappointed. Hats afraid no agreement with Moscow

can be reached on any major issue - if a cease-fire in Laos

cannot be arranged. The President took Khrushchev's words

seriously - in Vienna. Khrushchev, doesn't seem to be taking

them seriously?- in Vienna, or anywhere else.

The resignation of the entire South Korean Supreme comer as Court as a protest against the power of the junta. Chief Justice Pae Chung Kyun, declaring - that he and his colleagues on the bench cannot carry out their duties under an absolute government. "Absolute" is exactly what the junta has become - following its latest decree. The one that brings all executives, legislative and judicial power directly under the military men who are now supreme in Seoul. "Judicial" means - the courts. Beginning with the Supreme Court. The justices - not waiting to receive their new orders. Resigning - in a body.

A weird story is being told by one of the conspirators - involved in the assassination of the Dictator of the Dominican Republic. Pedro Celano, speaking from a hospital bed - after being wounded and captured; says theoriginal plan was - to kidnap Trujillo. He says the signal agreed on was for three blinks of a car headlight. But the explains that the conspirator in the car - forgot to give the signal. Whereupon shooting started - and Trujillo was killed - this contrary to the wishes of the men who killed him.

One of the "freedom riders" arrested today in Jackson, Mississippi - is the New York head of the N.N.A.C. Percy Sutton, arriving by air - from Montgomery, Alabama. Then violating the Mississippi segregation laws at the terminal. he was hustled off to jail - along with his white companion - Mark Lane of the New York State Legislature.

This we hear was aggravated when his P T boat was rammed by the Japanese destroyer - his boat cut in two -- in the Pacific. As a rext result, he wears a brace - and a lift in one shoe.

The present difficulty we are told came about as a result of a tree planting ceremony in Ottawa. But, he went right ahead with his European trip - in spite of the injury.

Today the President got along without crutches greet
when he went to the airport to great President Fulbert
Youlou of the Republic of Congo. That's the Congo that

formerly was week under French rule. Next door to the former Belgian Congo.

The President walked with a slight limp - explaining that he wants to try one more day - without crutches. Maybe a few days in Florida will do the trick. That's his hope.
