President Kennedy is having his first vacation since inauguration day. There's still official
business to attend to. Like - the phone conversation
with Secretary of State Rusk, who reported on the Seato
conference. And cur Chief Executive signed some letters
- and other documents.

But basically, President Kennedy is busy relaxing over the Easter Holiday. Concentrating on golf and swimming - with a possibility of some touch football - at his father's home in Palm Beach.

Mr. Kennedy doesn't seem disturbed by reports of a kidnapping threat aimed at his daughter. Secret
Service Agents believe that a Castro gang - intended to
seize three year old Caroline Kennedy. And - the First
Lady too. Se security regulations are being strengthened
- around the President's family.

An official in Paris remarked today with a Gallic shrug "so near and yet so far." He was referring to the snag -in the Algerian peace talks. The ERRER conference between France and the Moslem rebels - was supposed to begin next Friday. But today at the rebels - postponed it.

The official explanation in Tunis - is that Paris is trying to split the Moslem opposition. Negotiating with more than one rebel group. Ferhat Abbas, leader of the F L N, considers himself - the only legitimate spokesman for Moslem Algeria. He demands that the French accept him - as such. And he's holding up the peace talks - until he receives that acceptance from Paris.

There's no official indication that the assassination of the Mayor of Evian - had anything to do with the cancellation. Evian, is the French town - where

the conference is due to be held. Today, Mayor Louis Blanc was killed - by a time bomb. Suspected assassins - right-wing French settlers we who don't want the Algerian peace proposed by DeGaulle.

FLOOD FOLLOW WEATHER

In Moscow, the newspapers have just published

reports of a disaster that happened - two weeks ago.

News Kiev, in the Ukraine.

of a dike on the Dnieper, The flood hurtling down that in a solid wall twelve feet high. An avalanche of mud and water - smashing into East Kiev. Carrying away part of a cliff - with houses on the summit. Demolishing homes - and public buildings. A factory and a streetcar round house - staply disappeared.

The toll - damage in the millions. A hundred forty-three injured. A hundred and fifty - dead.

The Governor of Iowa has declared half of his

state - a disaster zone. Governor Norman Erbe, referring to the area * stricken by floods. Above all the valley of the Cedar River. Actually, the sites can't be pin-pointed on the map - because the Governor doesn't know what the pattern of destruction will be in the next few days. That's the reason for - the blanket declaration. Half of Iowa - disaster zone.

The crest of the Cedar River - is seven feet
above flood stage. Close to the twenty-foot level - that
set a record back in Nineteen Twenty Nine. Tonight, the
river is beating against the levee of sandbags - while
thousands of workers keep watch around the clock. Five
thousand people have been evacuated - from their homes.
While the damage already caused by the Cedar - is estimated
at seventy million dollars.

Meanwhile, quite a few other states are being battered - by the early spring weather. In Mississippi -

more floods. In Louisiana and Georgia - tornadoes. In Kansas and Colorado - another ten inches of snow.

New York will be represented in Charleston, South Carolina, when the centennial of the firing on Fort Sumter is commemorated. The Empire State's Civil War commission had threatened to boycott the ceremonies because of segregation in Charleston. President Kennedy entered the dispute - by asking the national Civil War Commission to act against discimination on so historic an occasion. As a result, the site of the celebration is being switched - to the U.S. Naval Base at Charleston. The base - is integrated. So New York's Chairman announces - his group will be there. Historian Bruce catton, prein pointing out that now the circumstances in his words, "represent the deepest meaning of the Civil War."

The Icebreaker "Glacier" has blazed a trail
in Antarctic waters 4 that may not be matched for another
hundred years. So says her skipper - Captain Philip Porter.

Montevideo Harbor, Uruguay - after the deepest penetration ever, into the Bellinghausen Sea, down there near the South Pole. The "Glacier" and her sister ship, the "Staten Island" sailed where no ship ever sailed before. To do it, they had to cut a channel twenty-four miles wide - through ice twenty feet thick. And they made it, all the way - to the Antarctic continent.

he set up a landmark where they touch the continental shelf. Then he and his crew turned around - and made the return voyage out into the Antarctic Ocean. They had set a new record for South Polar exploration - by sailing clear across the Bellinghausen Sea, and back.

Out in the waters of the East Indies, the American ship "Hope" - is full of flowers tonight. Northing unusual about that - on Good Friday. The unusual thing- is the donor ext of the flowers. The Mohammedan community on Flores Island--helping to celebrate the sacred christian holiday.

Flores - the East Indian Island devastated by earthquakes. The city of Endeh - demolished. Twenty thousand people - fleeing to the hills. The toll of dead and injured - not yet estimated. But it's km known to be - high.

Enter - the "Hope." Our mercy ship - anchoring offshore. Taking the injured aboard for medical treatment.

More than thirty operations - have already been performed by the American doctors. Twelve major operations today.

Mohammedans. But for once their faith in the prophet -

isn't preventing them from celebrating Good Friday.

Thanking the Christians from the West for helping them - when they needed help in the worst way.

In Jerusalem - the historic pageantry of Good Friday in the Holy Land. Five thousand pilgrims, following the path that Jesus took from the city to Calvary. From the place where Pontius Pilate ashed his hands - to the tomb where the Church of the Holy Sepulchre now stands. - the Via Dolarosa,

The Pilgrims began in the Israeli sector - of Jerusalem. Crossing over into the Jordanian sector through an opening in the barbed wire. Continuing along the Fourteen Stations of the Cross. A procession - lasting two and a half hours.

The vigil at the church of the Holy Sepulchre will be maintained until midnight tomorrow. Then bells will peal, candles will gleam, joyful psalms will be sung - and the celebration of Easter Sunday will begin.

The performance was on - when a car roared past. Machine guns opened up - throwing the crowd into a panic. But the gunmen fired over their heads.

Shortly afterward, hundreds of them surged toward the stage - shouting "Cuba Si, Russia No" and - "away with Communism."
