Solidarity Day at the Poor People's campaign  
in Washington - <sup>with</sup> a massive tribute ~~today~~ to the memory  
of Dr. Martin Luther King. Thousands of Americans -  
black and white - gathering at the steps of the Lincoln  
Memorial, Carrying onward Dr. King's famous dream of  
~~one~~ <sup>An</sup> America - where ~~not~~ "all men are created  
equal."

Where the masses were ~~not~~ hopeful though - the  
oratory was angry, militant, demanding, speaker after  
speaker ~~not~~ warning of dire consequences - perhaps  
an end to Dr. King's creed of non-violence - if the  
pleas of the poor are unheeded.

Less bitter - but still strident - the widow  
of Dr. Martin Luther King, Mrs. Coretta King, accusing  
the United States - of lying to itself about the so-called  
equality of negroes - of wasting its energies on "an  
immoral" war -- of keeping its poor "depressed,  
oppressed, and repressed."

The Reverend Ralph Abernathy - Dr. King's successor - last to take the podium. Charging that the poor have been deprived of promise - by quote - "the unjust, immoral and tragic escalation of the war in Vietnam." Vowing further to continue the Poor People's campaign - "until justice rolls out of the halls of Congress and righteousness falls from the administration."

~~Although~~ By then <sup>the</sup> about two thirds of the crowd has already drifted away.

VIETNAM

On the war front - at Hue -- a sweeping new general mobilization order today. South Vietnamese President Thieu issuing a proclamation - ~~men~~ making draft-eligible all men, age eighteen ~~to~~ thirty-eight. This expected to place under arms by the end of the year -- perhaps as many as two hundred thousand more men. Raising South Vietnam's total armed strength - ~~now~~ to nearly a million men. Thieu adding that this will make additional U S troops ~~un~~<sup>unnecessary</sup>.

PEACE FOLLOW VIETNAM

On the peace front - at Paris - same old story ~~today~~ - only moreso. Ninth round preliminary talks - again failing to get the discussions off dead center. The United States calling for a Geneva-type conference -- assuring Hanoi that we want ~~to~~ no permanent military bases in South Vietnam. The North Vietnamese, as usual - rejecting U S arguments. Adding there can be ~~now~~ no serious talk of peace - as long as Washington demands reciprocal acts of "restraint" from Hanoi.

Along the way - North Vietnam's Xuan Thuy saying he would be willing to meet with Senator McCarthy; if the Democratic presidential hopeful comes to Paris next month -- as he has said he might. Beyond that - the two sides agreeing to meet, henceforth, only once a week -- only on Wednesdays. Barring, of course, special circumstances - should any rise.

WALTER REED

Latest from Walter Reed, Army Hospital  
~~in Washington; a report today that former President~~  
Eisenhower - has experienced "occasional irregularities  
of the heart beat." Doctors noting, however, that  
this condition - is responding to appropriate therapy."  
Adding that there have been no signs of heart failure -  
and "the General's spirits remain good." Next scheduled  
bulletin - tomorrow morning.

PARIS

With less than four days till elections - scattered violence erupted today across France. Including a bomb-attack on two leftist candidates - in the eastern city of Metz. Both - injured seriously. Education officials further ~~are~~ reporting that about forty colleges and universities - all, it seems, but ~~the~~ the Sorbonne - are still occupied by rebellious students.

Meanwhile, the French government appealed today - to its common market partners; seeking a ~~a~~ postponement of the July one deadline - when final tariff barriers are to be swept away. Premier Pompidou saying France needs more time - to recover from crippling strikes of the ~~the~~ past six weeks.

WHITE HOUSE FOLLOW PARIS

*A related item - from the White House.*

*President Johnson today officially enrolling the United States - in the new "paper gold" international monetary system. Member nations agreeing to trade "special drawing rights" -- instead of gold - in international transactions.*

*This a move to undercut speculators - and also ~~to~~ to fight hoarding, which has been sanctioned, if not encouraged, until recently - in France especially.*

HARRISBURG

The State of Pennsylvania - first in the nation to allocate cash payments - to help support affiliated church ~~related~~ and private schools. Governor <sup>Ray</sup> ~~A.~~ Shafer -- signing the enabling legislation today at Harrisburg, calling this an "historic day in our commonwealth - indeed, in our nation." The Governor going on to say: "Our aim is not to aid a particular religion or belief - but to educate a child to be a good and decent citizen - to live a productive and full life."

GRAND CENTRAL

World famed Grand Central station - once  
the "crossroads of a million lives" - itself destined  
for a new lease on life - according to construction  
news today - from New York.

U. G. P. Properties, Incorporated, announcing  
plans to build a new fifty-five story office building -  
atop the aging railroad terminal. Basic design feature  
calling for a central ~~spine~~<sup>spire</sup> -- to support the entire  
weight of the building. No columns. Giving the planned  
structure -- "a floating appearance" - we are told.

MOSCOW
