Good people, move on as you are—with a smile, if you please and allow yourself the pleasure of enjoying what you are for as long as you see fit.

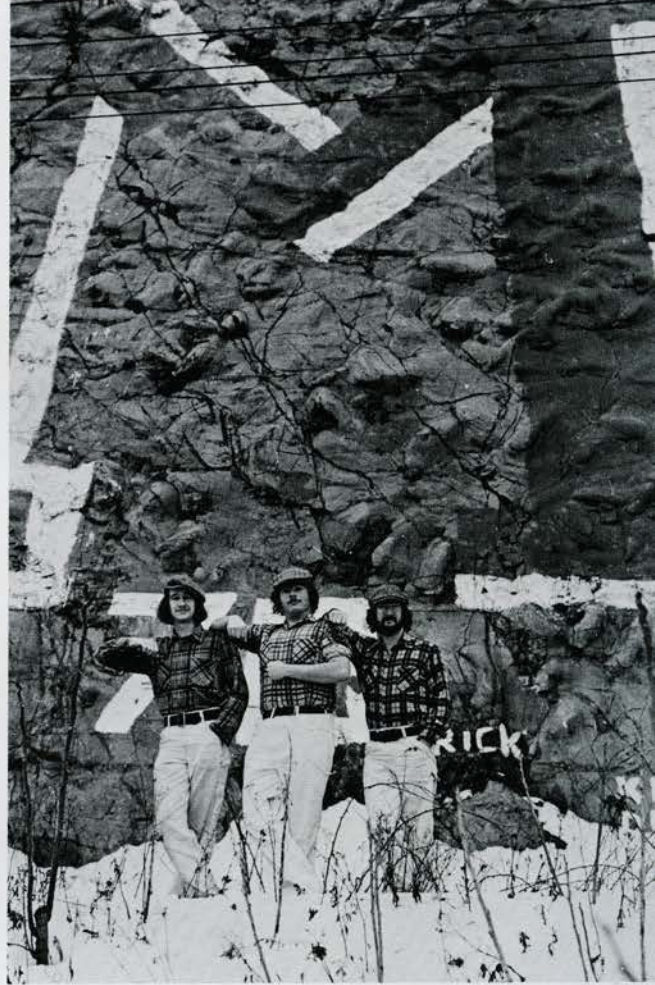
