Eater telling newsmen - the Middle East is not nearly the tinder box that some would have us believe. said he, "The cease fire is not on the verge of collapse"-"nor is the Middle East on the verge of explosion," - said he. What about prospects for peace then? We'll know more on that - said Eban - with the start of another UN peace effort around the middle of next month. In the meantime though - he rejected flatly any suggestion of a phased withdrawal from conquered territory. "There can be phased negotiations" - said he - "but no phased withdrawel."
