From Hanoi - from Ottawa, Canada -- from London, England, comes the faintest glimmer of hope tonight; hope for peace -- in Vietnam.

French sources reporting from Hanoi - that

peace talks could begin within three or four weeks; if

only the United States -- would stop bombing North

Vietnam. Canadian Foreign Minister Paul Martin reporting

from Ottawa - that Hanoi has expressed an interest in the

mechanics of getting negotiations started.

Diplomatic sources in London - going still further. Saying that North Vietnamese President Ho Chi Minh - is seeking "clearance in principle" from Red China; clearance to negotiate a pix peace with the United States -- quote, "if the terms are right."

All these reports - funneling into Washington.

But as yet - nothing official. And Secretary of State Dean

Rusk, for one - sharply discounting the supposed peace feelers. Dean Rusk admitting though - the he would be most "interested in learning what is behind them - if anything."

Meanwhile, anything but peace - in Vietnam itself. Today's major action ranging from a bitter battle in the Man Mekong Delta - to the South; to another long-range gun duel - across that supposedly demilitarized zone in the North.

Halfway between - the capital, of Saigon; where runner-up Presidential candidate to Truong Dinh Dzu - was convicted in absentia today; convicted of writing a bad check - and sending money illegally to San Francisco.

Sentence - nine months - plus a fine of nearly thirty thousand American. However, Dzu's attorneys - promptly filing a notice of appeal.

You all have heard what altitude is likely to do to the Olympic athletes, when they arrive to take part in the Nineteen Sixty-Eight Olympic Games at Mexico City, at an altitude far higher than anywhere they have been staged in the past. Mexico City is almost a he half mile higher than Denver, Colorado - altitude seven thousand four hundred and forty feet.

The word is that most of the other countries who stand any chance at all of making an important showing in the summer Olympics, already have their athletes training, somewhere, at high altitude. What are our American Olympic athletes doing about it?

Mad Now our Olympic Committee and coaches have decided to send our athletes to Colorado and other western states.

I spent most of my youth at an altitude of more than two thousand feet higher even than Mexico City, at the top of the Rockies, at ten the thousand. We worked in mines at eleven thousand and higher.

In high school days we had difficulty getting teams to come up from lower altitudes to prover play us. Colorado Springs, Denver, Pueblo and Canon City always wanted us to come down to them. Whenever they did take a chance and come up to our altitude, usually we ran them ragged.

So, I suggest our Olympic athletes go to Cripple Creek and train there.
