GENEVA GOLAN HEIGHTS

In the Middle East - on the Golan Heights - a sudden welcome stillness today. The guns of war giving way to an historic agreement - signed at U N headquarters in Geneva. Israel and Syria agreeing to a disengagement of forces - in their first accord ever; ending for the moment - at least - more than twenty-five years of intermitten warfare.

While here at home - the return of Secretary of State Kissinger; on his arrival at the White House - marked by a standing ovation from invited members of Congress. Dr. Kissinger saying to them - there is still "a long way to go." Adding, however, "the most difficult problem that of the two sides learning to understand each other - may ^{at} last have been overcome."

TRIP FOLLOW GENEVA GOLAN HEIGHTS

Dr. Kissinger also meeting privately with the President - to discuss his forthcoming trip to ~~Europe~~ Russia. The date for that - today set at June twenty-seventh - with a side trip to the Middle East - expected to follow immediately thereafter.

This - following a letter from Senate Majority
Leader ~~Mike~~ Mansfield, ~~who~~ ^{ing} urged the Supreme Court
to remain in session all summer, if necessary - to
deal with Watergate related cases.

VIENNA

At Vienna - ~~amex~~ a meeting of officials representing the world's major oil producing nations. A spokesman later saying an attempt will be made - to freeze oil prices as of July one. "We want to make Nineteen Seventy Four-a year of stability," said he. ~~Adding, however,~~ ^{But} that ~~no~~ adjustments will have to be made - "if the industrialized nations fail to curb inflation."

KATHMANDU

From Kathmandu - a report today telling of a new trade treaty - between Nepal and Red China. This to include the opening - of two new high altitude passes - one at Raswa in Central Nepal - the other at Yari in West Nepal. Both aimed at facilitating border trade between Nepal and Tibet, which ^{is under tight} ~~remains, of course, under~~ Chinese control.

WHITE HOUSE

The White House again - President Nixon today announced the completion of a new trade agreement - between the U S and the European Common Market. This to include a reduction of about a billion a year - in import duties on American goods ~~sent~~ sent to Europe.
