

**Brother Agustin Francisco:— (left)**




**Brother Dennis Maura:— (below)**




**Brother Cyprian**


**Brother Damian Eugene**


**Brother Dominic Bennet:— (left)**


**Brother Francis Martin:— (right)**


**Brother George Matthew:— (right)**


**Brother Joel Gilmory:— (right)**


**Brother Joseph Stanislaus:— (left)**


**Brother Jules Andre:— (right)**


**Brother Kevin Luke:— (right)**




**Brother Luke Francis:— (right)**




**Brother Patrick Stephen:— (right)**




**Brother Paul John:— (left)**




**Brother Philip Gerard:— (right)**




**Brother Robert Marcellin:— (left)**




**Brother Rudolph Maurice:— (right)**






