ANTARCTIC RESCUE

At this moment, a big plane, with special ski landing gear, is somewhere in the air between New Zealand and the Antarctic continent. The pilot and crew are off on an adventure a rescue mission, to attempt something never done before.

I have just been talking to the Washington office of Project "Deep Freeze", which is under command of Admiral Reedy, with whom I flew over the South Pole a few months ago. Admiral Reedy is sending the plane to rescue one of his men who has been in an accident, in the Antarctic. Bethel McMullen of Port Hueneme, California, had been working on a McMurdo construction project, until he fell from the second floor of the fire station house there on the Ros Sea ice shelf. Result -a fracture of the spine, paralysis of the leg, cerebral concussion, and other injuries.

But right now it's the mid-point of the Antarctic winter, the dark South Polar night, when no flying is done.

In April, Nineteen Sixty-One, a Russian was rescued from the Antarctic by our airmen; but April is the Antarctic

autumn. Still light part of the time.

The plane now flying south over that wild ocean is a Hercules C One Thirty. Her chief pilot, U.S. Navy Commander Fred Gallup.
