Back in Washington - the ninetieth Congress
was moving rapidly toward adjournment today. Giving
final approval to a whopping pay increase -- for both
servicemen and civilian government employees. Also
speeding on its way - a bill to pay for the war on poverty.

Leaving an expected floor fight on the new social security
bill ## as the only real obstacle toward a weekend
adjournment.

Elsewhere in Washington -- a final decision today in a long-standing dispute. With the Internal Revenue Service revoking - as of tomorrow - the traditional tax-exempt status of some ten in thousand publications; including the National Geographic - nation's business - the journal of the American Medical Association -- and so on.

The revocation also applying in the case of <u>business</u> activities & of all other charitable and otherwise tax-exempt organizations, whenever said business activities - are in direct competition with non-exempt businesses.

membership in the European trade group - despite DeGaulle's

veto of two weeks ago.

West Germany, Italy, Belgium, Holland, Luxembourg indeed, all members except France - clearly in favor of

British membership -- said Commission President Jean Rey
of Belgium. Adding that continued French opposition would

bring on a "grave crisis" - both "inside and outside" the

Common Market.

Also in Brussels - a meeting today of Nato Defense Ministers, Agreeing to the first major change in Nato defense strategy / since Nineteen Fifty-Six, when the Nato allies decided on "massive nuclear retaliation" -- as the major deterrent to communist aggression.

Now - Nato approving a new American plan; calling for a "flexible" Nato strategy -- based on the use of both nuclear and non-nuclear weapons. As such - supposedly giving the Nato allies more leeway - in dealing with small brush wars; while reducing the threat of a major conflagration - through errors in judgment.

At the same time - Nato decided to establish a small task force fleet in the Atlantic. Also agreeing to give smaller countries a greater say - in future nuclear planning.

Senator Thomas Dodd of Connecticut - has dropped his million dollar libel suit against two Washington columnists. Drew Pearson and Jack Anderson - whose revelations resulted in Dodd's censure by the Senate for financial mis-conduct.

The decision taken today - in a Washington District Court, With Dodd pleading financial hardship - as his reason for giving up the action. However, the Senator pressing on with a second charge - that the newspaper men used documents they knew were stolen.

The prototype of a revolutionary new electric

car - was unveiled for the first time today in Detroit.
