The United States has demanded the release of all
Americans - still held in Red China. The deme was
Transmitted through Switzerland. The American consul in
Geneva - handing a message to the Consul for Red China.
The number is now sixty-three -- following the
release of the four airmen. Eleven other U.S. Flyers - in
Chinese jails. Forty one civilians - and eleven navy and coast guard men. These last, the Navy and Coast guard men, are new additions to the list.

Navy flyers - whose plane was shot down by the
Communists off the China Coast, in January of Last year. Coast
guardsmen - whose plane crashed while trying to rescue them.

The four released airmen arrived in Hawai1, today. The way they describe their new freedom is indicated by acouple of quotations.
"It's just like being reborn", said Captain Harold Fisher, the jet ace.
"The happiest day of our lives" shouted another. And there was a repetition of the word -
"wonderful."

In Hongkong, newsmen interviewed Robert Webster
Ford - British radio man turned loose by the Chinese Reds.
Ford - seized in Tibet five years ago when the Communists invaded the Himalayan land. He wats doing a job for the Tibetan government - sending reports by short wave from Cham do in Eastern Tibet. The Reds charged him with espionage, the usual thing - and he spent five years in a Chinese prison. We had talked to him by short wave in 1949, when we were in Lhasa and our last words to him rim were not to fallinto the hands of the Chinese Reds. He cheerily replied that he would make sure that should not happen. But a few months later they got him. Today, Bob Ford was reticent. He said - he had undergone the usual ordeal of questioning, the brain washing. And - had made a confession. In all Communist jails, said he - everybody confesses.

He was asked - if he felt he had been imprisoned unjustly? He replied "I prefer not to answer that question at the present stage".

But at Hongkong today, he did deny one thing. The quotation is curious. Ford reported as saying "I did not poison the living Lama, as they charged".

That seems a bit garbled. When he was arrested in Eastern Tibet, the Reds accused him of poisoning an important lama of those parts. Any lama is regarded as a reincarnation of Buddha, a living Buddha. Which may account for the curious expression - "living Lama". Today's dispatch is an ambiguous addition to a
remarkable story - of a young ex-R.A.F. radio man who with a short wave outfit was working on the Tibet - China border for the Dalai Lama talking each night to Reg Fox in Lassa who then reported to the Tibetan government.

Word in Washington is that the U.S. Ambassador
to Yugoslavia has been called home. To give - a first hand report on the talks between Soviet Russia and Yugoslavia.

Ambassador Riddleberger - to help in forming an estimate of what has happened.

> Opinion in Rome and London is - that Bulganin
and Khruschev may have accomplished more than would appear on the surface. Their real purpose - to secure Yugoslav neutrality. The Soviet policy now being - to create a buffer belt of neutral states.

In this, think Rome and Paris, the Soviet
negotiators may have been successful. Getting a pledge of neutrality - from Tito. A pledge - not to line up with the West.

It was announced in Washington, today, that the United States, Britain and France will hold high level talks with Yugoslavia - after the Russian leaders complete their present visit. Talks to concern - military aid.

There was a wild welcome in Tunisia, today. Three hundred thousand people - hailing the return of Habib Bourgyba, leader of the Tunisian independence party. Coming home - as a result of an agreement for Tunisian autonomy.

More than three years ago; Bourgyba was arrested by the French authorities - and sent into exile. His party, call, the neo-destour - having incited riot and revolution against the French. Demanding - independence. Bourgyba was taken over to France, and kept there. But, during his exile, the trouble only grew worse.

Recently, the French made an offer of home rule and Bourgyba, in Paris, was prominent in the meg g negotiations. These were successful - Tunisian home rule now going into effect. Bourgyba - sent home.

When he landed by ship at the $\mathbf{P r}$ port of Tunis,
a huge throng was there - chanting his name. On every side, the national flag of Tunis - a red banner with a white crescent, the crescent of Islam.
denies a set series of sensational rumors. About what

King Said had arrested his brother, Crown Prince Feisal, and a group of Feisal supporters. Charging them - wt with a conspiracy to overthrow King Said, and place Faisal on the sham throne.

The Embassy in Cairo says - it's all a fabrication, based on the fact that three persons were $\boldsymbol{x E E}$ arrested, charged with conducting Communist underground activities. One curious point is this. The Embassy spokesman
in Cairo proposed that a neutral press mission visit both Saudi
