GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

The world health organization, in Geneva, announces - the shipment of twenty-five thousand doses of cholera vaccine to Nepal. Where an epidemic - has broken out. The first plague of Cholera - that Nepal has had since the beginning of the century.

The latest - in bad news from various parts of Southern Asia. Cholera - rampant in India, Burma, Siam. Now - spreading to Nepal. The world health organization calls the situation - the "Most serious in years." Forty-nine thousand cases of cholera - reported. Nearly twenty-one thousand - fatal.

The ancient scourge - particularly in Asia. Modern medical science - rushing vaccine.

SUMMIT

At the U N, today, Britain made a formal request - asking for a special meeting on the security council. To be held - August Twelfth. And attended - by heads of government. The request - a formal move, preparing for a summit conference, under the Aegis of the United Nations.

Meanwhile, President Eisenhower has made his reply to Khrushchev - along the same line as the message sent by British Prime Minister MacMillan, yesterday. The President - naming the date, on or about August Twelfth, the place? The President says - New York, or anywhere in Europe, except - Moscow. Explaining to the Soviet Big Boss - Moscow would never do, because of those rowdy demonstrations at the American Embassy in the Soviet Capital. That affront - remembered, only too well, by the American people.

President Eisenhower also rebukes Khrushchev - for the blatant propaganda tone of the last letter from the Soviet Premier. And mentions one topic to be taken up -

when the heads of state are gathered at the summit. The question - of indirect aggression. How to prevent - one country from conspiring to subvert the government of another. With special reference - to subversive tactics by Soviet Russia and Nasser's United Arab Republic, in the Middle East.

At the same time, it looks as if one head of state will be missing - from the summit. DeGaulle - the French Premier still stubborn in his opposition to high level talks at the security council. Word from Paris - that General DeGaulle, instead of attending will send his foreign minister. Or - some other prominent French diplomat.

Well, if so - one interesting personality will be not be there. The tall DeGaulle - who, so often, seems unpredictable.

LEBANON

Left Wing extremists - are blamed for what happened in Beirut. Where, today - the city was showered with anti-American leaflets, demanding the withdrawal of American Marines and Paratroopers from Lebanon. Viciously worded pamphlets, with the slogan: "Americans, Go Home Today."

This was followed- by a bomb explosion. Blasting - on a street of shops. Killing - two people. Injuring -fifteen.

The leader of the rebels holding sections of Beirut, declares - that his people had nothing to do with either the propaganda leaflets or the murderous violence. Saeb Salam stating - that his faction wants the American military forces to move out, all right. But that - it's a Left Wing outfit, which has been responsible for the terrorism all along.

The rebels are also demanding - the immediate resignation of President Chamoun. Saying - they refuse

to disband their insurgent forces, until Chamoun steps out. The Presidential term does not expire until September - and there's no sign that Chamoun intends to quit until the legal date.

American Secretary of State John Foster Dulles declares - the US forces will be taken out of Lebanon, whenever the legal government requests it. And word in Beirut is - that the new President, Faud Chehab, has promised - that he'll ask for an American withdrawal. Which, of course, we suppose he can't legally do - until he takes office upon retirement - of President Chamoun.

In Beirut, they are also saying - that President Chehab will adopt a policy of "neutralism." Taking Lebanon - out of the western camp. Neutral, as between the free world and Communism.

Today following the compromise yesterday, political affairs were in a state of suspended animation. Both sides backing new president Chehab. Matters in abeyance - pending the retirement of President Chamoun, and the withdrawal of the American forces.

IRAQ

Britain - recognizes the new government of Iraq.
London, today - extending formal recognition to the
revolutionary regime that overthrew the pro-Western
government of King Feisal.

Other governments, like West Germany, have already
established normal relations - with the government of
Premier Abdel Karim Kassem.

The United States, it is believed, will soon do
the same thing.

All of which, by implication, disavows the claim
of King Hussein of Jordan - to inherit authority over what
was called the "Arab Union;" combining - Jordan and Iraq,
in competition with Nasser's United Arab Republic. Under
the terms of the "Arab Union," King Hussein would become
the sovereign - after the killing of King Feisal. But
it's only too clear that Hussein could hardly establish his
authority in Iraq, ousting - the Baghdad regime established

by the revolt. According to all accounts the new government of Premier Kassem has the support of the people of Iraq.

Meanwhile, in Baghdad a couple of Marine corps sergeants - have been arrested. Leatherneck Petty officers - attached to the U S Embassy. Sergeants George Hamilton of Century, Florida, and Philip Smith of West Palm Beach, picked up, when they went straying too near a big fire that's raging. The two - wanted to get a good look at the pyrotechnics.

The fire - at an oil plant, on the outskirts of Baghdad. A tank farm - operated by the British. One huge oil tank, bursting into flames. The blaze - out of control, in spite of Iraqi fire fighters, directed by the British. Lucky, they were - to keep the flames from spreading to the other tanks of oil.

Cause of the conflagration - unknown. With Baghdad - having all kinds of rumors. The government of Premier Kassem - urging the people to discount wild reports.

DUKE

A dispatch from London, today, states: "the Duke of Norfolk is exceedingly angry." The dispatch goes on to tell what happened - and you can't blame his Grace.

At Arundel Castle, historic seat of the Dukes of Norfolk, a charity ball was held. The London smart set - on hand for the festivities. Tickets costing - nine pounds each. With free champagne - provided by His Grace, the Duke. The champagne, it would appear, was the cause - of the uproarious proceedings.

Young Lords and Ladies - using tea trays as toboggans, sliding down - the grassy slopes around Arundel Castle. The Duke didn't mind that. Youth must have its fling, and all that you know. The outrage - was something else.

One of the guests at the party - the Duke of Edinborough, consequently, in proper medieval style the standard of the Queen's husband - flew from the flagstaff on top of the castle.

So - who swiped the standard of the Duke of
Edinburgh?.

The deed was done - by sprightly young aristocrats,
making their way - to the top of the castle. Shinnying
up the flagpole - and making off with that princely
banner.

The Duke of Norfolk would like to get his hands on
the wags who stole - the standard of the Duke of
Edinburgh.

MISSILE

An atomic missile - exploding in the ar Pacific, today. A rocket with a nuclear warhead - streaking high in the sky. Then - the power of the atom in a spectacular blast.

The experiment - at Johnston Island. The first successful American test of an atomic missile. Believed to be - short range, of a kind - that might be used for knocking out intercontinental ballistic missiles hurled by an enemy.

The fireworks were seen, today - all over Hawaii. Five hundred to a thousand miles away. A blaze of light - and the usual mushroom cloud. People in Hawaii - hardly able to believe that the explosion was as far away as Johnston Island.

RECORD

Six thousand eight hundred and seventy-three miles, non-stop - in a light plane. The record - set by Captain Marion Bolling, today. Who took off in the Philippines in a Beechcraft and flew, without a stop, across the Pacific. Landing at Pendleton, Oregon, this afternoon.

Captain Bolling, forty-three years old, is an airline pilot. Working regularly at the controls - of the big passenger planes.

Just doesn't get enough flying - as a pilot for United Air Lines.

RACKETS

The Senate rackets committee, today, heard evidence from a Detroit businesswoman. An attractive blonde - who told, simply and calmly, how she had been threatened. Mrs. Nancy Dawson - threatened with disfigurement, if she testified concerning labor-management abuses in the laundry business.

She told how, three weeks ago - her secretary received a phone call saying - that Mrs. Dawson had better keep her mouth shut. This - represented as coming from "Mr. Hoffa of the teamsters." Referring of course, to James Hoffa, President of the teamsters union.

The second threat, also relayed through the Secretary, said - if Mrs. Dawson kept her mouth shut, nothing would happen to her or her family.

Then a friend of Mrs. Dawson told her - how a man came to him and said: "It's too bad - she is such a good looking woman. It would be too bad - to ruin her."

But, in spite of threats, Mrs. Dawson told her story to the Senate rackets committee, today.

KILLING

Indianapolis police, today, made an accusation - in the killing of Forrest Teel, Vice-President of Ely Lilly and Company, one of the nation's largest manufacturers of drugs. A warrent sworn out - against Mrs. Connie Nicholas, a divorcee forty-three years old. Who was found unconscious in her automobile, shortly after the crime. Having taken - an overdose of sleeping tablets.

Mrs. Nichols - in critical condition, tonight.

First accounts given by witnesses made it seem - a gangland slaying. Forrest Teel, in his automobile - shot, it would seem, by a gunman in another car.

But, later, police learned - the woman had been seen getting out of the drug executive's automobile, right after the shooting. The woman - entering another car nearby. In which, they say - a man was waiting. That car - then speeding away, described as blue and white. Answering the description - of Mrs. Nichols' automobile, in which she was found unconscious.

She left messages - indicating a longtime romance with Teel. Which turned, finally, into a triangle - another woman in the picture.
