The city of Belgrade - scene of another American triumph today; as Richard Nixon became the first US president - ever to visit Communist Jugoslavia. The first a warm welcome - from Jugoslavia's President Tito; a welcome that was later echoed by some two hundred thousand persons - lining the route of the Presidential motorcade.

The crowds shouting over and over: "Neex-on -
Neex-on." At one of the main squares in downtown

Belgrade - finally forcing the motorcade to come to a

halt; with the US President climbing atop a parked car
the better to be seen. Briefly holding a baby - that was

thrust into his arms. All the while, shouting in Serbo
Croation: "Hvala leppo.! - Hvala leppo! - thank you very

much.!" The President later calling his reception - **

"magnificent" --- "very heart warming." And so a

gracious setting - for important talks soon to follow.

Andress Indeed, the President tolling assuring

Anyone skis

Tito: "You can be our friend - without being anybody's

enemy."

In Cairo - they came by the millions today. Young and old, rich and poor, kings and commoners - paying final homage to Gamal Abdel Nasser, the foremost leader in recent history. The mourners including Arab guerrilla leader Yasser Arafat - who wept openly throughout. Also, Soviet Premier Kosygin - who spent ten minutes or so attempting to console Nasser's widow. And only a short distance away - a grieving young man throwing himself under the week wheels of a street car where he died instantly. In his own mind - at least - thus becoming one again with his fallen savior.

On the domestic front - it's now official. The President's commission on obscenity and pornography - finally making public today its long awaited report; thereby confirming a sneak preview of the study - which has already caused a great deal of controversy. The commission's major members recommending a repeal of all laws - prohibiting the distribution of explicit sexual material to consenting adults; on the alleged grounds that they had found no evidence - that such matter played a significant role in causing crime, deviancy or sements severe emotional disturbances among youths or adults.

All of which was promptly branded - a "magna carta" for the pornographer. This - according to the commission's three minority members; one of whom - Cincinnati lawyer Charles Keating Jr.

a congressional investigation of the entire commission.

Keating - who was President Nixon's only appointee

to the panel - further calling its majority viewpoint

"shocking and anarchistic," in effect - said he advocating "moral anarchy."

Mean the Communists were launching a mortar attack on a nearby dam project; also, taking a couple of villages near the city of Tang Kauk - which was the scene of heavy fighting last week.

Here at home - Senate minority leader Hugh

Scott front and center again today. Expanding on his

remarks of yesterday - predicting that President Nixon

will soon announce an accelerated Vietnam withdrawal schedule. Scott now saying that all US combat troops

will be heading home - by next summer.

The Senator then went on to observe that US
air strikes in Vietnam probably will continue - "as long
as we have support troops to be protected there."

"But we're moving back toward having only advisors
in Vietnam." Said he. And he added: "Eventually - I
hope we get the heck out of there entirely."

The tri-state motor transit company of Joplin,

although not widely known to the general public.

From F B I Director J. Edgar Hoover, a statement tonight condemning the current wave of police killings across the nation. A condition which threatens said he - the nation's entire law enforcement system.

Says J Edgar; asserting: "Only an aroused citizenry

-- and swift and certain punishment by the courts" can

put an end to this "increasingly dangerous" situation.

And he added: "When a law enforcement officer dies at the hands of a bidex killer, part of our system of law dies with him."
