In a world already weary with strife and turmoil a sudden flare-up today in still another trouble-spot; with
Radio Pongyang reported the sinking of a so-called "American
spy-ship" - off the coast of Communist North Korea. Further
charging that the alleged "naval spy intrusion" - was but one
more in a series of recent "mad@provocations" against North
Korea "by land and sea."

But, the U.S. Navy in Washington - quickly refuted the Communist broadcast. Saying flatly - there is "no indication" of 'uny U.S. involvement." Washington added that the vessel in question was probably that of a South Korean craft - whose capture by North Korean gunboats was reported earlier from South Korea.

The White House - President Nixon named a new special envoy to the Vatican - namely, Henry Cabot Lodge. The White House saying that Lodge will visit with Pope Paul - two or three times each year; explaining the President's views - also, seeking the Pontiff's views. This marks the first official link between Washington and the Vatican - since Nineteen-Fifty. A move quickly welcomed by the Holy See - which called it "a chance for a more direct collaboration in the cause of peace."
