WHITE HOUSE

The White House again tells us the President will not be cowed by the recent attacks on his life. Ron Nessen saying the President is sticking to his travel plans - and will visit Chicago next week, as scheduled. And, that he is more than satisfied with the protection he has had from the Secret Service. And, that "we will see the President - shaking hands in public again."

CAPITAL HILL

If the President is satisfied with his protection ~~though~~ - the Congress is not. A Senate appropriations sub-committee ~~announcing today~~ ^{says} - it plans to hold hearings on the matter next week. Senator Montoya of New Mexico saying he plans to call to the stand - ~~Secretary~~ Secret Service head H Stuart Knight, and a number of former Presidential candidates.

NIXON

INTELLIGENCE

Secretary of State Kissinger - ~~again~~ in New York today; ^{met}~~meeting~~ with Israeli Foreign Minister Yigal Allon - in an attempt to further his plan for multi-lateral discussions on the ~~Middle~~ Middle East. The result a tentative endorsement of the U S proposal. Allon saying it's "too early to judge" - what sort of talks might take place; but adding the Kissinger plan "opens up ~~me~~ some new options^{"))} - ~~that will be discussed in due course.~~"
