CAIRO

From Cairo and Washington - a joint announcement today telling of the resumption of full diplomatic relations between the U.S. and Egypt; ending the breach that developed during the Six Day war in Nineteen Sixty Seven.

Egypt's President Sadat - publicly praising
Secretary of State Kissinger who was standing at his side.
And Sadat is urging Syria to work out, with Kissinger, a
military disengagement on the Golan Theights.

The one-time General further noting that Dr.

Kissinger was the first foreign official he had ever met while wearing civilian clothes. Observing that a "new exa"
has now begun. Adding that President Nixon has been invited
to visit Egypt - and is expected to accept.

President Nixon spoke today - at a young Republican conference in Washington; again saying he'll veto the Emergency Energy Bill - just passed by Congress. He insists it - would only result in longer gas lines and rationing.

He also told the young Republicans "You can take pride that you supported the men and policies - that put an end to the war which was here when we came into office."

Adding that in the next three years, "we can make great progress in world peace - and on the home front; moving forward toward prosperity - without war, and inflation."

"Keep your confidence," said he - and there will be a Republican in the White House not only for the next three years but for eight years after that."

When he finished - they makes chanting over and over - "three more years! - three more years!"

WASHINGTON FOLLOW PRESIDENT

The Executive Committee of the Democratic

National Committee today heard their National Chairman,

Robert Strauss, say it was the Democrats themselves who

re-elected President Nixon - as he put it: "By their

"petulance, bitterness and rancor."

He also said an out of court settlement has now been reached - in a civil suit filed against the Committee to Re-elect the President. This - in connection with the Watergate break-in. The Democrats said to have agreed to settle - for seven hundred and seventy thousand bucks.

The selection of a jury was finally completed today for the trial of former cabinet officers John Mitchell and Maurice Stans; thereby clearing the way - for new indictments in the Watergate case; maybe by tomorrow.

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CBS news in Washington has learned that no indictment will be directed at the President of the United States. However it is understood that the Watergate Grand Jury is preparing a strong statement dealing with the President's involvment in the Watergate and that this will be presented to Judge Sirica.

ADDIS ABABA

Addis Ababa - the Lion of Judah bowed today - to the demands of his mutinous troops. Emperor Haile Selassie ordering immediate pay raises - for all members of the Ethiopian armed forces.
