President Nixon mationwide radio

and television tonight <u>and</u> announced that our military forces in Viewn Vietnam will be reduced by another fifty thousand men by April fifteenth. This would bring the total announced reduction to a hundred and fifteen thousand troops since the time Mr. Nixon took office on January twentieth when our total troop strength in Vietnam was about five hundred and forty thousand.

Speaking from his White House office, the President told the nation: "This reduction is another orderly step in our plan for peace in Vietnam. It marks further progress in turning over the defense of South Vietnam to the South Vietnamese. It is another clear sign of our readiness to end the war and to achieve a just peace."

Still, the President was only "cautiously optimistic" about the situation, over all. With regret,
