Arthur Goldberg today formally stepped down from the Supreme Court -- to become the new U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations.

His former colleague -- Supreme Court Justice Hugo Black -- administering the oath of office, in a ceremony in the rose garden of at the White House -- attended by President Johnson and many other officials.

Goldberg responding with a statement that he has no
