is coming when Britain will have no defense. No way to repel attack. Minister of Defense Duncan Sands declaring that Soviet Russia "hatronank "quite soon" will be able to launch atomic missiles at speeds of more than five thousand miles an hour. Adding - that, at present, there is no defonee against a weapon like that.

So Britain can rely, no longer, on orthodox meme of
defense. Depending, instead - on the prevention of war, by weans of what Sandy called, the "atonic deterrent." Atomic missiles, that is. Britain - to cooperate with the United States in guided missile development.

Optimism in Washington - concerning the latest
american proposal to Israel. The belief - that Egypt will
accept the suggestion. Whereby - the United States would sonde shipping into the Gulf of Aqaba. To establish the
principle - that the waterway should be a open to all nations,
including Israel. The United States - also to push a plan for having the O.M. station soldiers in observers in the case Strip. To keep that sector - from being used as a base for seaptian raids.

In Cairo - angry newspaper talk against this U.S.
offer to Israel. Which might seen to indicate - rejection. But officials of the state Department donit/finks so.

Intimating - that Egypt has given assurances that she will
go along with the new program.
In Israel, the government of Premier Ben-Gurion is
now studying the american offer.

Eisenhower Doctrine, tomas - but, with a last minute melisa modification. which changes the wording. Saying the United states is "prepared to use armed force". Instead of giving the President the "authority" to do so.

Today, President McDonald led Rarick - by one hundrod
and eighty-nine thousand to thirty-cight thousand. An
unbeatable - five-to-one. In the central Pennaylvania
steel plants, the opposition got a good deal of support. But elsewhere, the MCDon forities ran as high as -thirty-to-one.
