Detroit, Pittsburgh and Chicago - out alert tonight. Against
the threat of a possible Black Power plot - stretching

public warning; after a night of violence in that city - that

left ten dead, some forty wounded. "I believe" - said he

- "this is a conspiracy by black militant groups - to spread

destruction, disrupt the government, show their strength;

to prove they are a power to be reckoned with - that they

can do anything they want at any time."

Even so - Mayor Stokes tonight ordering withdrawal of Mational Guardsmen and police - from riot-scarred Megro neighborhoods of Cleveland. A bold move designed - said he - "to calm the area" - to relieve tensions.

Behind the Iron Curtain, a tense silence along the Soviet-Czech frontier. And silence also, regarding that projected meeting between the communist party presidiums of the two countries. Some reports say the meeting is already under way - others - that it will begin tomorrow. Also indications that the Czechs may be stalling for time demanding preliminary talks on the make-in of opposing delegations. In Prague - a Czech government spokesman further saying - the projected meeting might bring a compromise "But there is no room for changing our political line" - said he.

Soviet troops continued their "maneuvers" today - just across the border from Czechoslovakia. With additional Red ARmy units - still not withdrawn from that country.

Serving as a key element - in the Kremlin's continuing "war of nerves" against the Czech reform movement.
