For President Ford - at the <sup>Helsinki</sup> ~~so-called~~ "super-summit" ~~in Helsinki~~ - another non-stop performance; ~~today~~; ~~including~~ breakfast with Turkish Premier Suleyman Demirel - lunch with the leaders of Britain, France and West Germany - and ~~a final requisite~~ <sup>work</sup> on the speech he plans to deliver tomorrow. All this - in addition to attending the parley's two-a-day formal sessions. <sup>Quite</sup> a schedule!

~~When all was done~~ <sup>In a</sup> ~~the final~~ summing up <sup>by</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>has</sup> Secretary of State Kissinger, The President <sup>offer</sup> ~~ed~~ Turkey Fifty Million in temporary military aid ~~and to~~ in return for a reopening of <sup>those</sup> U.S. bases, ~~as Turkish will~~ ~~But~~ Turkey's reply - in effect, all or nothing. Dr. Kissinger adding that the Greek and Turkish Cyprus dispute - is now "a disaster for all concerned."

As for the President's luncheon talks - these producing a joint statement from the U.S., Britain, France and West Germany: all pledging to take "definite and clear action" - if Israel is expelled from the U.N.

"No one should try to dictate to other peoples - on the basis of foreign policy considerations of one kind or another - the manner in which they ought to manage their internal affairs." Dr. Kissinger <sup>terming</sup> ~~calling~~ this - a rather "conciliatory speech."

And now —

~~Here at home.~~ The House today approved a six-month extension of current price controls - on domestic oil. This in place of the President's plan for gradual decontrol - which the House rejected late yesterday.

But White House spokesman Ron Nessen, in Helsinki <sup>was</sup> saying the President will veto the latest House action, <sup>with</sup> ~~"it's all over" - said he. Adding that~~ price controls ~~will~~ <sup>to</sup> ~~these~~ expire ~~as of~~ <sup>at</sup> the end of August; with oil prices - then left to seek their own level.

The House was also criticized by Energy Chief Frank Zarb - for failing, as he put it, "to come to grips with the hard issues." Zarb further saying that gasoline prices could well hit Seventy Cents a gallon - within six-to-nine months.

<sup>Ghandi's</sup> government must be very, very confident."
