A Moscow announcement makes it official - Sputnick Two
has fallen from its orbit. The largest man-made satellite
ever launched - weighing eleven hundred pounds, carrying the
sled dog Laika, inside. Sputnik two revolved around our planet
more than two thousand times - traveling over seventy millon
miles.

We were warned by American and British experts - that the satellite would probably come down during the weekend. And it did. Sputnick Two, plunging to destruction over the Caribbean - at about nine p.m. last night. A blazing display, observed by hundreds on the island of Barbados, in the British West Indies.

The first Soviet Sputnik fell in December. So now the only artificial satellites in the sky - are the three sent up by We.

One new factor in the International dispute, Weare told that Secretary Dulles now has the backing of the NATO

Powers - in his cautious approach to the Russians. Our Allies, accepting the need to find out whether Khrushchev is sincere - before meeting him at the Summit.

Informed sources in London declare - Britain and West Germany have reached an agreement about the payment of British troops on German soil. As we know, London has demanded that Bonn contribute to the support of those troops. The Adenauer Government, turning down the demand. But Chancellor Adenauer is due to arrive in London - on an official State visit. And the belief in London is, that a the new agreement will be announced during his stay. In fact

Here are the terms according to this report! - NATO, to contribute fifty percent - to the cost of maintaining those British troops in West Germany. Bonn, to pay, in advance, part of its debt to Britain. And arms for the West German Army - will be purchased in London - through an advance payment. Britain, in turn, pledging to keep at least fifty thousand men in West Germany as a deterrent to aggression by the Communist bloc.

More tension in the Middle East. Five Syrian border guards crossing over into Lebanon last night. They were ten miles inside
Lebanese territory - before anyone spotted them. Then a fermer gave
the alarm. Lebanese troops, rushing to the scene - a gun battle
erupting. The Syrians, hiding in a woods - shooting it out, until
their ammunition was gone. Then four surrendered. The fifth,
escaping back into Syria.

The Syrians insist they were after smugglers - crossed the border without knowing it. But some members of the Beirut Parliament - are calling for a state of emergency. And the Lebanese foreign minister - wants a joint investigation by Lebanon and the United Arab Republic of Syria and Egypt. Charles Malik, cabling Cairo - asking Nasser to __ acd do t send a delegation -- before the Syrian-Lebanese frontier becomes any more explosive.

The word from Indonesia to Government Naval Forces are meeting at a rendezvous in the Indian Ocean. Sukarno, massing all-out ships and men for an invasion of Sumatra.

Meanwhile, his ground forces continue to plunge ahead - cutting off the rebels from the sea - except in the South.

The President of Indonesia, sending three columns into

Tapanuli Province - where they captured Padang, and Sistapuam.

This drive cut off the supply port of Sibolga - so the rebels

now control only the road running South.

And the Loyalist invasion is already threatening that road - mopping up within ten miles of it.

In Hong Kong, Foreign Minister Subandrio told newsmen the rebellion will be crushed within a week. The foreign minister declaring, "Military operations are now in their final phase".

Jakarta attributes the failure of the rebels - to low morale.

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They re said to be well equipped for jungle warfare - but too many
of them feel that Sukarnos victory is inevitable.

Tonight the Cuban rebels are holding a secret conference somewhere in Oriente Province. Fidel Castro, shaking up his
High Command. Trying to find out who was responsible - for
the failure of last weeks uprising against Batista. The uprising,
put down by Batistas forces - with almost four hundred rebels
killed.

The violence appears to be petering out. Some shooting today but no mass attacks by rebels troops anywhere in Cuba. Some schools,
open for the first time in a month. Many newsmen, packing up ready to go home. They came to Havana to cover Castros war against
Batista - but now they figure the rebellion is just about over.

That shooting at Haiti's embassy in Washington - was caused by the recall of one diplomat. Andre Toussaint, summoned home.

Blaming it on unfavorable reports by Counsel Samuel Devieux.

After getting the order, Toussaint went into Devieux's office,

with a Colt revolver in his pocket. The two men were heard

quarreling - then a shot. Devieux, killed instantly. Toussaint,

now a prisoner in the embassy... until Haiti decides where he

Pound, accused of making pro-Axis broadcasts from Italy - during World War Two. Captured by American Military Forces in Mineteen Forty-Five. The poet, protesting he was not a traitor. But he would have been accused of treason, except that he was declared insane and sent to a mental hospital. Where in Wineteen Forty-Five, Ezra Pound wrote one of his greatest works - the "Pisan Cantos" - which won him a prize for the Best American Poem of the Year. An award that raised a storm of controversy. Some critics feeling, it should not have gone to a man accused of treason.

But Robert Frost and other writers - have been urging the release of Ezra Pound, saying, that despite his political views he's a great poet.

Today's motion, filed by Thurman Arnold, former

Assistant Attorney General. Arnold, pointing out that

since Pound is insane, he can't be brought to trial. Also

that he'll never recover, as long as he's in that mental

hospital. So the lawyer is asking the Federal Court - to

release Ezra Pound.

A barracks in Camp Drum, New York. A hotel in Portsmouth,

And he defeated seven opponents at the Tchaikovsky Piano Contest in Moscow. Winning a Gold Medal - and twenty-five thousand rubles.

His playing, so superb that he has been receiving compliments from top Soviet musicians. Emil Gilels, often called Russia's greatest master of the keyboard - describes Cliburn as "The Best Pianist of the Younger Generation." "The Best Of The Best," was the way he put it. Aram Machaturian, composer of the famous "Sabre Dance," says he hasn't heard anyone play as well as the six-foot four young Texan in any previous Conservatory Contest.
