PEACE FOLLOW PARIS

peace talks? Sixth round discussions ending today - with both sides conceding the total absence of progress,

North Vietnam's Xuan Thuy again flatly refusing the idea of mutual de-escalation in return for a complete U.S. bombing halt. Refusing to pay any "ransom" - as he put it. Averell Harriman replying that "the United States will go far and fast" - but only if Hanoi shows some restraint.
