The wiestern victory - not without cost though.

In response to pressure from the "young Turks"

-- McCormack agreeing to give the full House Democratic membership - a greater voice in committee assignments; also party policy decisions.

In the tense Middle East -- deepening crisis today with Israeli jets attacking Jordan for a third straight day. According to Amman - an unprovoked assault. According to Jerusalem a strike directed against Arab guerrilla bases located in Jordan.

Meanwhile, the Soviet Union was launching a new Mid-East peace offensive in London. Soviet

Ambassador Mikhail Smirnovsky, meeting with British Foreign Secretary Michael Stewart; reportedly urging the U.S. - Britain and France to join with Russia - in a "Big Power" peace move. However, President

Johnson tells us the United Nations is still "the most appropriate way of seeking peace in the Middle East."

More on the same - from Turin, Italy; where the Turin newspaper La Stampa - today published the transcript of a New Year's interview with Pope Paul.

The Pontiff asserting that the great powers might have to intervene - to restore peace in the Middle East.

This marking only the second time that the ever Pope has permitted an interview for direct attribution.

Excidentally, The Turin interviewer - Reporter** Arrigo

Levi - a Jew; who greeted the Pontiff with the words
"Shalom, llekha." "Peace be with you." Pope Paul's

response -- a beaming "shalom, shalom" - said the

reporter. "Peace, peace." So, will it come, soon?

For the first time in two weeks - signs

of movement today in Paris. Number two U S peace

negotiator Cyrus Vance - conferring with Saigon delegation

chief Pham Dang Lam. Vance later moving on to a
