At our Embassy, the statement is that one Marine buckled on an unloaded pistol before going to help eject the communist deputation.

Moreover, he testified in behalf of the German conductor, Wilhelm Furtwangler, when that musician was put on trial as a Nazi.

Hence, the heavy police protection in Tel Lviv tonight -- with the menuhin concert the scene of a demonstration by manes the more severe element of the Orthodox in israel.
