U Thant bids farewell to sixty-

scheduled news conference of the year - U Thant discussing first and foremost, Vietnam, Suggesting that the question of a U.S. bombing halt -- should be put to a vote of the full U.N. General Assembly. Admitting, however -- it's not practical; which probably means a continuation of the Vietnam deadlock -- "for another year or so."

Next question: What about the possibility of submitting to a U.N. vote - that Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia? "I am not equating the two situations" said U.Thant. Adding heatedly: "If the Russians were bombing and napalming the people of Czechoslovakia you aaw would see what I would have to say."

ADD U N

Reaction many from Washington - fast in coming. Indeed, US Ambassador George Ball - requesting and getting afmeeting with U Thant just a few hours later. Ball telling the Secretary General that the US po does not regard his remarks - "as in any way helpful in furthering the serious and sensitive negotiations for now in progress in Paris."

PARIS

On the peace front- in Paris - Hanoi's

propaganda mill was **chrnk** churning away again today. A North Vietname se spokesman claiming that more than a hundred and twenty thousand South Vietnamese draftees have defected to the Communist ranks. Hanoi's Nguyen Thanh Le also asserting that American air and artillery attacks on North Vietnam- have actually increased over the past two months.

A second report from Paris / telling total of an opparent agreement to scale down the war in Vietyam; an gereement supposedly savotaged - by a leak at the White House. However the US State Department Salling this report -- "nansense!"

DETROIT

The cost of new cars - going up, no question about it - but maybe not as much as originally feared. At Detroit -- General Motors announcing today a price hike - averaging out to about forty-nine bucks a car; UL which is only about half that announced last week - by the Chrysler, Corporation M's andouncement promptly raising the question - whether there was any sederal pressure brought to bear; especially in view of conferences last - between industry and government officials. week G M Chairman James Roche say "Ther However was a frank discussion - but there was no pressure." Be that as it may - Ford is now expected to conform with the G M price list; whit with Chrysler "price "rollback" - same as last probably to order

year -- in order to remain competitive.

TEXAS WHITE HOUSE FOLLOW DETROIT

Meanwhile, the Texas White House - was attempting to speed things up. President Johnson hailing the G M announcement -- as "a step in the right direction" also voicing his hope - that the "entire industry" will follow suit. L B J setting the potential saving to consumers consumers - at about three hundred and fifty million.

VIETNAM

War news from Vietnam tells today of a soox full scale security alert - in and around the great city of Saigon. Allied forces - guarding against the threat of terror attacks **Allerche** that might be intended to mark today's twenty-second anniversary - of the start of the French Indo-China War.

STUDY FOLLOW VIETNAM

At the same time 2 a report today that the U.S. command has ordered a nationwide study. Purpose: to find out whether any American soldiers can be pulled out of Vietnam -- without impairing the war zonx effort. However, U.S. sources emphasizing atk that a cutback, if any - would not involve actual combat troops. It would rather be a process - we are told - of "slicing the fat off the logistical system," _ meaning support troops.

SENATE FOLLOW STUDY

Here at home - a charge tonight that Robert McNamara committed a grave error in judgment early year. At least - so says the Senate sub-committee on military preparedness. Acclusing the former Defense Secretary - of grossly underestimating the **theox** threat from Russia's rapidly growing submarine fleet. Accordingly, the sub-committee urging an

immediate re-evaluation - of US nuclear submarine needs. Asserting that McNamara's ban on the building nuclear subs after Nineteen Seventy One - should be lifted. POLLS

In the battle of the polls - it's Richard Nixon still ahead tonight though fattering slightly; with thubert Humphrey - hanging in there at second place; and George Wallace - closing our on the outside. In other words - the latest Harris poll give Nixon - thirty-nine percent - Humphrey thirty-one per cent - and Wallace twenty-one per cent. PRAGUE

In any case - it looks like a long, cold winter for Czechoslovakia. With Soviet occupation forces -reportedly taking cold moonax weather precautions today. Also, ordering evacuation of the Czech army's huge **HIMME** barracks - near Prague - to make way for Russian troops to eccupy them,
