On the economic front - an increase of one point nine percent in U.S. industrial production in September. According to the Federal Reserve Board - the largest monthly increase in industrial production in more than a decade. BUENOS AIRES

An Italian business executive living in Buenos Aires and his bodyguard were both shot to death today in the Argentine capital. The city was also rocked by a number of explosions - ~~the work~~ apparently ^{the work} of renegade leftists in the Peronist movement. The leftists earlier threatening a blood bath - to disrupt the reassumption of power by President Isabel Peron.

STOCKHOLM

The winners of this year's Nobel Prize in Medicine - a trio of Americans; Dr. David Baltimore of MI T, - Dr. Howard Temin of the University of Wisconsin and Dr. Renato Dulbecco formerly of Cal Tech; for discoveries - "concerning the interaction between tumor viruses - and the ~~genes~~ genetic material of cells." The Nobel committee calling this a giant step - in cancer research.

WELFARE

The cost of welfare in the U S during the year ended June thirty - twenty-two point six billion; an increase of more than four billion or twenty percent - over the year before. This according to figures announced today - by the Department of Health Education ~~and Welfare~~ and Welfare which blames most of the increase/on the soaring cost of medical care.

SAN FRANCISCO

From the new head of the American College of Surgeons in San Francisco - a call today for stricter self policing to reduce medical mal-practice costs.

PILLS

From the food and drug administration -

a warning today that birth control pills can be hazardous

to ~~your~~ health. ~~But~~ F D A saying it is now convinced

beyond a doubt ^{that} the uses of birth ~~control~~ pills are

likely to cause ~~more susceptible to~~ blood clotting, and related problems -

such as ~~strokes~~ strokes. The F D A ^{saying} ~~adding indeed,~~

it will soon require the use of labels - advising women

over forty ^{to use} ~~they'd be much better off using~~ "other

forms of contraception."

FOOD FOLLOW PILLS

Government doctors also warned today that children who eat canned baby foods - may be consuming potentially hazardous quantities of lead. The worst of the lot - we are told - canned orange juice; and, next in order - ~~apple~~^{apple} juice, apple sauce and peaches. ~~The problem - it seems - is the fact that~~ ^{They say} children tend to absorb more lead from food - than do adults.
