On Capitol Hill - the battle began today. Treasury

Secretary John Connally - appeared before the House Ways and

Means Committee; urging speedy approval of President Nixon's
new economic program - in toto; asserting that "this carefully
balanced program will be seriously impaired - if any of its
important parts are not enacted."

Connally also denied that the President's plan -
constitutes a "business bonanza," as some have charged. He
added, that there must be some follow-up - to the present
ninety-day wage-price freeze. After breaking the back of
inflation - said he - "were not now going to walk away from
it and just leave it."

Along the way though, Committee Chairman Wilbur

Mills - let it be known that he, too, has some strong views; including - number one - a projected One Billion dollars in tax relief for the poor. This - said he - to provide "some additional incentives to individuals - to buy more."

ROGERS

Secretary of State William Rogers - another
Cabinet-level witness today on Capitol Hill; testified before
a Senate Appropriations Subcommittee - in behalf of a proposed

Three-point-Three Billion-Dollar foreign aid program; and
there finally agreed to "work out some accomodation" -
whereby the Senate could scrutinize that top-secret five-year
Pentagon plan for military assistance.


Rogers stressed however the report in question-
was merely an "internal working document." Adding: "Until
a decision is made - it is improper and disorderly to have
these comments floating around."

torrential rains; at one point, totaling nearly five inches - in a single hour.

Closer to home - a storm area stretching more than
four thousand miles across - threatened today both America's East and Gulf Coasts. This - according to the U.S. Hurricane Center in Miami - a massive circulation of air;" covering "the entire Gulf, Western and Central Caribbean Sea - and part of the Atlantic;" containing within its boundaries - no less than four major storm systems.
Of these - the worst so far is clearly Edith - a
"classical hurricane;" at last report, Three-Hundred-andForty miles south-southeast of Kiss ton, Jamaica, and moving westward. "A good candidate" - we are told - "for storm of the year."

At Belfast in Northern Ireland - a series of earlymorning bombings today. Also, the shooting of a British sentry - at nearby Newry.

This coming in the midst of a so-called truce-
supposedly ordered by the militant Provisional wing of the outlawed IRA; and thus drawing from regular IRA her inters in Dublin - a public condemnation. The new violence- said
to be an example of irresponsible "stunting." The regulars adding that it also indicates/"the extent of the lack of control and discipline that exists in the provisional organization."

At the same time - here in New York - a decision today barrffif from these shores - IRA Provisional leader (KÁㄴㄴ)
Joe Chill; on the grounds that he failed to possess a valid visa - having attempted to conceal a thirty-year-old murder conviction. And so ends - Cahill's projected U.S. fundraising tour.
