basis. While here at home - President Nixon was arranging
to meet with Henry Kissinger and other top advisers to chart
strategy for the resumption of full-scale peace talks next

Monday.

Meanwhile this is another peace rumor from Saigon;
with the U.S. and North Vietnam - said to have reached a
tentative accord, with a ceasefire agreement - supposedly
set to take effect around mid-January. "hen asked for
reaction - the White House issuing a brief "no comment."
